EASTER IN ANDAMOOKA – changes to events and activities

Due to the rules and restrictions put in place by Government to contain the spread of Covid19 (Corona Virus), we are taking steps to work within those and in the interest of community health and wellbeing, as we work through what was planned to be a busy and exciting Easter in Andamooka.

These measures and planned events are as per the current status of risk in this region, but this could change on a day by day basis, so please check notice boards and the website for changes.

Underlying all events in 2020 is about the first years of settlement in Andamooka during the 1930's celebrating the first of our 10 year, Decade by Decade Countdown to Andamooka's 100year anniversary in 2030.

CANCELLED: Sunday 5th April, launch '1930's Andamooka, Living History Exhibition' However, work still continues on the exhibition and it will be displayed as planned and added to over the year, so locals and visitors alike will have the opportunity to learn more about our very early years and to contribute as we uncover more and more about those harsh but successful early opal mining days in Andamooka and the characters that first pioneered our town and community.

GOING AHEAD: Easter Thursday is the opening of 'The Great Outback Opal Hunt' with a twilight 'fossick by ultraviolet' activity. The Hunt will offer the chance to win Andamooka Opal and other great prizes and will run till the 29th August, commemorating the day that precious opal was confirmed from Andamooka in 1930. Competitors will need to register at the Post Office. Funds raised will go towards community programs and facilities.

KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS

WHERE IS THE FUTURE HEADING FOR THE OUTBACK?

The March APOMA committee meeting focussed around concerns with regional funding for the out of areas region in which Andamooka sits, and how that works in conjunction with the long-term sustainability of our town and management model in the current funding climate.

Considerations and challenges include:

- With national disasters at an unprecedented level together with the pandemic of corona virus, demand on Government funding on a federal and state level is currently being pushed to a new extreme which will require review and change.
- Short term this is expected to flow through to impact visitor numbers which will impact upon our economy in particular over the current and next financial year.
- Long term is an open book with change afoot in regional /out of areas funding sources we need to push the significant economic value of the outback vs funding via a regional approach.
- So we need to establish the governments vision for the outback and the focus for distributing funding regardless of how that is sourced. Who is included and the manner in which they will be funded?

Andamooka offers a traditional outback experience, historic mining of an internationally promoted Australian icon, and can provide international visitor experiences as well as domestic. Currently on a government level there seems to be no broad thinking or support in terms of capabilities of individual towns or groups of towns and an expectation of small outback towns that 'volunteers will take care of the real outback.

So now is the time to work with other towns within the un-incorporated areas and other enterprises to seek joint opportunities and to ensure that the second option is implemented and that those 'in the middle' of the arterials do in fact benefit and not be by-passed through lack of inclusion, promotion and funding.

IN THE MEANTIME - WHAT DOES ANDAMOOKA DO?

With an Asset Sustainability Levy (ASL) considered a possibility to be implemented over the next few years, the challenge is that we maintain a balanced approach as we move forward into change, which will not negatively impact on people's lives, local business, on new and developing income streams and community programs that are working towards greater levels of self-sustainability.

Andamooka has always been a town that looks after itself – the very fact that we pay a CCS is evidence of that, and so, rather than wait for the axe to fall, we need to act now as a community... and a region...

On a regional basis, we need to jointly and actively work with other towns and industry, to put forward our value as a region together with our collective needs and plans for the future, and to work out how we best move the region and its towns and communities forward into a vital and sustainable future.

GRANTS

Funding applications for Community Recreation Facilities resulted in a \$50,000 grant assigned in the first stage, being forwarded to the Minister for final approval.

The Country Arts SA grant for the Minnie Berrington documentary has been granted an extension so that filming can be done over winter.

A grant application has been lodged for outdoor activity equipment.

BUDGET OUTCOMES FOR THE SECOND QUARTER 2019/20






LEGEND: 1. ADMINISTRATION 2. COMMUNITY BUS



Can I burn plastic and other household rubbish?

No, burning plastic, household rubbish, tires, treated timber and listed wastes (Schedule 1 Part B of the EP Act) is prohibited under the Air Quality Policy.

Backyard burning in Andamooka is reportable to the OCA and people breaching the policy can be subject to a fine.

Remember that no open fires other than gas or electric are permitted during the fire ban season & on a total fire ban day without a schedule nine permit.

ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY PROJECTS

Fit-out of the community kitchen/workshop is forging on with the cabinets being put together ready for installation of appliances and benches. On schedule to be ready by Easter.

The youth storage cupboard has been installed and the new sliding door unit has been delivered ready for installation. This will provide more contact between the two youth activity spaces and less space intrusion into the 'white room' by a hinged door.


This has freed up space for the Wi-fi hub where the bench has been installed and internet connected ready for youth activities and homework nights and for the 'Be Connected' program to get up and running.

The additional 2 power points to the Caravan & Camp Ground have been installed to meet the increased high season visitor demand for power and work has been done on the development of a camping area adjacent to the existing shelter shed.

The Old Post Office has a new floor installed and in the process of a face lift ready to house a new business venture in town. The re-purposing of this historic building will now return funds to the town and self-support maintenance of that site.

The Lapidary Shed is in the process of upgrading to accommodate the new Community Lapidary Program which is due to launch over Easter. This project was put on hold so the Old PO could be ready for occupation in March.

The existing Community Church, which is awaiting the outcome of an insurance claim for repair of storm damaged walls after which time its future use and development will be determined.


RE-BUILDING ANDAMOOKA'S HISTORY

NEW LIFE FOR HISTORIC 'OLD POST OFFICE'

Surprisingly few people in Andamooka are fully aware of the history and beginnings of the 'Old Post Office' building located in what is becoming developed as 'Arty Andamooka' corner where Christmas Hill Road joins Opal Creek Boulevard.

For some years, since the post office first relocated to the then medical centre at the location of the current Town Office in the early 70's before moving to its present home in 1996 at the legendary 'Bottle House' complex, this non-obtrusive building has been used for a variety of purposes ranging from a workspace for the history group and tasks such as producing the Andamooka Press, to a tea room for the CDP group and for storing files and various bits of equipment.

However, few know that behind the rather plain facia of the front extension lies the original semi-dugout



structure of the first post office in Andamooka with its log and metal ceiling and the original supporting poles, which opened on the 13th January 1947 as a non-official post office manned by Andamooka's first post mistress Minnie Berrington. From this humble structure, Minnie acted vitally as a conduit for news, information and assistance for local miners and visitors. This section of the building is as strong as the day it was built and still utilised as an integral part of the building.

This plain, utilitarian building is now being given a face lift and new life as a functional shop to house a new retail clothing business owned by members of an historic Andamookan family, Tamee and Amanda, daughters of Julie Christie, grand-daughters of much loved town matriarch, Bev Burge. The 'girls' are keen to promote the history of the building by decorating the shop with historic photographs and other items.

Over the past two months, passing residents may have noticed a lot of activity going on around the building as a group of volunteers, CDP crew and town office staff assisted by the new tenants, work to repair and renovate what was a rather rudimentary floor, paint the interior and upgrade the outdoors space ready to have the business up and running by the end of March. It will be so good to see it become a vibrant part of Andamooka life again.

The Andamooka Opal Fields non-official Post Office was once the vital link to the outside world and friends and family, considering that there was no other form of communication at the time until a radio-telephone office opened in December 1948. Minnie handed over the post office to Dick Clark around December 1949.

The radio-telephone office was eventually combined with the PO in May 1965, which is about the time that the new extended front was added. In September 1967 Andamooka was allocated the 5722 post-code and in January 1985 the status was changed to an official Post Office Agency, the name changed to Andmooka PO in July 1990 and on the 31st August 1993 the status was changed to a licensed Post Office. During this process the Post Office changed hands from Dick to Terry Cavanagh in the mid 60's who passed it on to Margaret Buzza who relocated to the medical centre in the early 70's and from there to Margot Duke, the current post office licensee and relocated to the current premises which also houses the local mines agency, an amazing array of opals and jewellery and the renowned Andamooka Underground Museum, once again establishing the PO as a one stop shop for information about Andamooka and opals for locals and visitors alike.

On behalf of APOMA committee and members, we wish Amanda and Tammy, all the success for the future with their enterprise housed in these historic premises, and we encourage all our locals to visit the shop.

DECADE BY DECADE: THE 1930s

The miners of "Andamooka's Pride" one of the most valuable early finds on the Andamooka Opal Field

In 1936 when Minnie Berrington, the first female opal miner to own and mine a claim in her own right, was finding success mining her 'stones of fire' including black opal, another two pioneering men Walter 'Pop' Bartram and his friend, Mr. Wundersitz, decided to try their luck mining opal in the new Andamooka opal fields. They did quite well and were later joined in 1938, when the population numbered around 30 people, by Pops son-in-law Bern Grund, who was experiencing hard times farming in Kimba during a significant drought and the depression, and they joined forces to mine together. Mining for 9 months of the year earning around 5 pounds a week, being around 2 pounds more than the basic wage at the time, they did quite well and so could spend the hot summer months in their southern homes.

Mr Wundersitz was a hard worker who could manage double the digging of most miners on a day by day basis. Living was tough, as was the mining. Shafts were dug about 4'6" by only 2' wide, barely large enough for a person to fit into let alone use tools to extract the dirt and hopefully opal. Fortunately, much of the opal in those days was found at a depth of around 20 to 30 feet.

In September 1940, mining partners Pop Bartram and Bern Grund unearthed at a depth of 28' a valuable high quality opal gemstone on their claim at Stephen's Creek (now simply called 'Stephen's) on the Andamooka opal fields. The opal was said to be the best quality that chief buyers had seen from the Andamooka field, which made it pretty special given the high quality of opal being found on this field. This gem was given the name Andamooka's Pride.

Pop Bartram purchased the second half share of the opal in the rough at a price offered but not accepted from a buyer, and later Bern Grund cut and polished the much admired stone which was then sold to Mr Agnes Donaldson of Melbourne in May 1945 at an undisclosed price.


The Bartram family stayed on in Andamooka and one of Pop's grandson's, Keith, is still actively involved with opal cutting and polishing and with managing the town and community today. Keith is one of the driving forces behind the new

lapidary facility and program, and once open, he will be conducting workshops there teaching the basics of how to cut, shape and polish opal, imparting his talents in the special art of determining and enhancing the best 'face' to maximise the brilliance of the stone.

A good practice is to keep a large, firm pressure bandage at hand in your car and home.
