#### BHP FUNDING ACCELERATES COMPLETION OF COMMUNITY KITCHEN

It's full steam ahead with a major fit-out for our Community Kitchen thanks to BHP Vital Resources funding.

APOMA has been working steadily on the fit-out of the community kitchen /workshop facility at the Community Hall. The structure was made possible by funding from FRRR in 2018 and throughout the construction phase in 2019 a raft of fundraising activities and events have gradually raised around \$3000 towards the fit-out together with income resulting from the hall hire and rentals including café lease fees.

We had just commenced installation of the kitchen cupboards, storage and benching when Covid-19 hit.

As a consequence fundraising activities stopped and our fundraising officer, Tanya Simpson has been concentrating her hours now on her other community liaison role to assist the community with food supply options including fresh meat, fruit and vegetables and especially for those most at risk within our community with picking up other items and essentials in Roxby Downs or taking the bus across so they can attend medical appointments.

Critically as winter approaches and the likelihood that this will mean at risk members of the community need to take extra care, we recognise that we need to be making sure that they have their needs met with food deliveries and including hot readymade meals. This put the need for fast-tracking finishing the kitchen fit-out and the installation of equipment that was previously set for purchasing as funds became available.

Fortunately BHP Vital Resources funding offered the opportunity for us to apply for funding to not only complete the kitchen but to fit it out to commercial level so as to ensure that we can meet food management requirements for sorting orders and providing hot meals to our vulnerable and disadvantaged community members.

The application was successful with \$58,000 in funding provided to not only upgrade and complete the kitchen fit-out, but also in the

interests of maintaining community wellbeing, to have the food management program up and running by winter and importantly with the means to assist community members who do not have access to or the skills to stay connected via internet for such things as on-line doctors appointments, government agencies, IT equipment to assist the program reducing the need for money handling and importantly for connecting with friends and family during this isolating period, which will keep our most vulnerable and disadvantaged healthy, happy and safe

This also will provide the opportunity to have take-away meals available to the whole community providing a bit of welcome relief for families and others, plus will cover additional costs associated with extra hours and special requirements around the extended use of the community bus and vehicles to service community needs.

On behalf of the community of Andamooka, the APOMA Committee acknowledges and thanks BHP for their much needed support for our community which will not only greatly assist us through this crisis and have us prepared for the next crisis, but has provided the community with a fully equipped kitchen that will support cottage industry and youth hospitality training, a variety of community workshops to increase the health and wellbeing of the community.

Further funding provides for assistance with on-going internet connectivity for those in need.



#### **KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS DURING THE COVID-19 CRISIS**

Thanks to funding from grants and BHP Vital Resources Funding, Andamooka is riding out the Covid-19 crisis. Although there has been a significant drop in income streams over the past few months, there have been significant gains associated with asset investment that will assist with developing new income streams and with facilitating community programs for the future. There is also the opportunity to apply for further funding to assist with putting measures in place to assist the community through this crisis which we will look to take advantage of to put in place various services.

The state and federal governments are keen to see a gradual return to 'normal' and to see our economy fired up again. And amough and to day economy has felt the effects of travel restrictions and the resulting loss of tourism dollars.

SA Tourism has recognised the opportunity created by travel restrictions for the state to benefit from intra-state travel, so they are about to launch a promotional campaign to encourage South Australians to go out and explore their own state and in particular visit the regions, including the Outback, investing tourism dollars within SA rather than interstate or oversees.

Plans are to open up Andamooka in a gradual and restricted manner that will see visitors once again within the town from early June, but mindful of keeping our residents safe

The caravan park is set to open around the end of May to self-contained vans only, with numbers restricted to a manageable level. Visitors will be welcome to stay in self-contained units, the motel and holiday houses under government recommendations around numbers and for measures to prevent spread of infection.

We will be welcoming back take-away meals and lunches, available from the new Community Kitchen on various days and nights commencing around the end of May – these will be advertised on posters and Facebook. There is plenty of outdoor seating for folk to sit outside in the sunshine to enjoy a bite to eat with a hot or cold beverage.

The Great Outback Opal Hunt will formally kick off on the June Long Weekend with modified rules in place and numbers controlled at designated fossicking sites.

The Lapidary Workshop will be open for 'give it a go' activities over the June Long Weekend with numbers restricted at any one time to ensure correct social distancing is maintained.

Other businesses such as Desert Threads have opened by appointment and some will welcome restricted numbers of casual shoppers.

Andamooka has done an amazing job of taking on preventative practices throughout this pandemic and we thank all those associated with the RFDS health clinic for their amazing work and support for our community.

The public toilets are now closed overnight as the only issue we have experienced through the Town Office has been the unnecessary theft of large toilet rolls and soap from the public toilets, with the culprits destroying the dispensers in their quest to save a few dollars that could have purchased toilet rolls and soap from our local Friendly Grocer.

So, we will continue to move forward cautiously under the advice of Government and experts, and in a manner that our community feels safe and comfortable with, but with the knowledge that as we emerge at the other end of this crisis, our community will have benefited well and will have new programs, activities and facilities to enjoy and to benefit from as we move into the future.

# Can I burn plastic and other household rubbish?

No, burning plastic, household rubbish, tires, treated timber and listed wastes (Schedule 1 Part B of the EP Act) is prohibited under the Air Quality Policy.

Backyard burning in Andamooka is reportable to the OCA and people breaching the policy can be subject to a fine.

Remember that no open fires other than gas or electric are permitted during the fire ban season & on a total fire ban day without a schedule nine permit.

# **ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY PROJECTS**

Thanks to funding via the OCA from federal Drought Relief funds, the Lapidary Workshop project is steadily moving ahead with the intention for this to be completed by June 30 and ready to be put into action when restrictions around Covid-19 are lifted.

The cement flooring has been completed and the next stage is to insulate and line the walls and secure the workshop, install the water connection which is fed from the water tank situated on the hill behind the workshop and tidy up electricals.

Next the benching and storage cupboards will be installed ready to set up the equipment and workbenches and

we will be ready to start demonstrations, 'have a go' activities and small group workshops, which will lead onto more advanced workshops and eventually to holding accredited lapidary courses.

There is a bit of tidying up at the front of the workshop to create more parking space, so we welcome offers of voluntary assistance with this.

With around 30 people having registered their interest in workshops and several locals having put their names down to assist people with 'getting started', there is eager anticipation around the launch of the lapidary program which maybe as early as around mid-year.

There is also great interest from visitors which means that the Lapidary Program will create another visitor attraction and income stream, which will contribute to both the towns economy and to positive visitor experiences that will encourage return visits and promote our town's opal industry.

# Call out for creative volunteers with time on your hands Design one of nine 'putt-putt' golf 'holes'

A mini-golf course has been a popular subject of discussion for many years for those looking for something for local entertainment for families, groups or individuals and also visitors.

So we are seeking creative locals to take on designing one of 9 putt-putt greens made up in typical Andamooka style from bits and pieces, especially items associated with opal mining, with a theme promoting Andamooka — maybe mining, maybe a business, or past activity or historic structure or machine???

The mooted idea is to install 7 holes laid out within the trees near the playground,

the 8<sup>th</sup> hole at the Town Park for walkers to take a break on the trip between the camp ground and the 9<sup>th</sup> hole which has been suggested should appropriately be located outside of the Post Office so that golf clubs and bits can be returned and also conveniently next to our 'local watering hole'.

Once the course designs are decided we will form a working group to design the course and to work on the construction. There are no timelines set for the project which will be dependent on community involvement, but we do have a few enthusiastic locals who want to make it happen sooner rather than later.

So, if you are looking for an interesting challenge why not look around for some quirky bits and pieces and turn them into a fun golf station, which could put your name to something special in Andamooka.





#### **KEEPING SAFE IN AN UNSAFE WORLD**

Andamooka is facing a challenge like no other, but our town has a reputation for standing up in the face of adversity. Our community is entering unprecedented times that have been described as a peaceful war, but a war no less. We find ourselves up against a world-wide enemy with no alliances or preferences as to who it attacks or kills. Capable of wreaking havoc on the economy on a world-wide scale and on individuals, households and communities with sometimes devastating consequences, and for no reason other than, because it will.

This enemy is so tiny it can float on air for hours and attach itself to clothing and shoes or be breathed in by unsuspecting people moving around in public places. When coming into direct contact with people it can penetrate into the skin and enter through eyes, noses and mouths. It is so resilient it can live for hours or days on surfaces of counters, tables, chairs and lounge suites, on floors and on door-handles, light switches and other surfaces we touch so many times throughout our daily lives. Also, on items on shop shelves and surfaces and in the dust that gathers in public spaces.

With so much potential for contact or exposure by everyone every day, it brings us all onto the same level and into the same fight, to slow this enemy down and keep outbreaks at bay till it can be controlled.

Put simply, the more you interact with others or visit places others frequent, the more likely you will contract this virus. The major defences we have are diligence, awareness and caring for ourselves, our families, our friends and our communities. Here in South Australia and especially in our remote regions, our allies are space, fresh air and sunshine, and in Andamooka we have 'community'.

We are all part of a small community that has so many who are at risk by age, illness, and those with existing health conditions or complications, also mental health issues. It is our actions now and on-going that will tell whether as a community we stay safe.

Anxiety and fear is another enemy we face as a community at this time. Maintaining a calm and generally happy approach will serve to keep us healthy and happy, and it will ward off the potential damage to the community or to individuals resulting from 'crowd hysteria', finger pointing or panic. So finding timely solutions to issues as they arise or pose a concern is critical. Don't hold back on reporting concerns or asking questions if in doubt. The RFDS health clinic has up to date information and can assist you with health concerns.

If you need to self-isolate for 14 days or to minimise contact with others and abstain from going to public places there are plenty here who will help you through the process. Don't hesitate to call the Town Office for assistance with shopping or take-aways, pick-ups for such essential items as prescriptions, or with access to the internet.

As you go about your daily life, be kind and considerate of others, treat yourself and everyone else, as if you or they might be carrying the virus and act accordingly, exercising hygiene and social distancing practices. Think of it as being in a warzone... be careful, be diligent, beware... we are all in this together fighting an invisible and potentially deadly enemy.



# **Police Report**

I hope this report finds everyone well and in good health. I know that there many uncertain things occurring at the moment with regards to the Covid-19 virus. I want to assure everyone that the South Australia Police are working with medical staff and the state government to contain this virus and stop the spread. I ask that everyone else do the same, and keep up to date with media releases and advice from the government and medical professionals.

As usual over the past few months there have been a number of incidents relating to traffic offences. 2 females from Andamooka have had their vehicles impounded for driving whilst disqualified, and will be summonsed to appear in court at a later date. On the 4<sup>th</sup> of March a 28 year old man from Andamooka was stopped driving an unregistered vehicle on the Andamooka road, and was detected drink driving. He was issued with a 6 month instant loss of licence and will be summonsed to appear in court at a later date. On the 26<sup>th</sup> of March a 21 year old female from Roxby Downs who held a learners permit was arrested after being detected travelling at 170 kilometres an hour on the Andamooka Road. She was charged with travelling at a dangerous speed and breaching her learners permit, and was bailed to appear in court at a later date.

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of March a 30 year old male, formerly of Andamooka, was arrested after being located in a stolen vehicle, breaching current bail conditions and engaging in a police pursuit when he failed to stop for police. He was caught by the patrol after becoming stuck, and was refused bail.

There have also been a number of thefts reported and people reporting suspicious activity. If you do see something suspicious or out of place please ring for police to attend by calling 131-444.
