• **NEW MEMBERS** – apply by downloading a copy of the membership application form from the website or available at the Community Hall, Bottle Shop or Post Office. Fill in and return together with your application fee by email to secretary@apoma.com.au or by post to PO Box 246, Andamooka 5722.

To be eligible to stand for Committee – please lodge your application by Friday 25th Aug. 2023. **To be eligible to vote at the AGM** – new members must have their application <u>lodged with APOMA</u> for acceptance a clear month ahead of the AGM. *The Ordinary Meeting at which acceptances will be considered prior to the AGM is set down for Thursday 26th October so please provide time for collection and post, if not lodging direct via email or in the Office.*

• **EXISTING MEMBERS** – if you have not yet renewed your 2023 membership or joined as a new member in the period commencing as of 1st October 2022, you are no longer a financial member and need to renew to be eligible *to vote*, or to stand for committee, or to nominate, second or be nominated for committee.

If you have not renewed years prior to 2022 – be able to make your vote count at the 2023 AGM. If you renewed in 2021 but not 2022 your membership renewal for 2023 can be renewed by paying up for both 2022 and 2023, subject to committee sanction. Community groups are humming with activity, and sales of their art and craft works is lively. The Hall is full of exhibits and chatter, and traditional community events being revived. Numbers at the school are growing and finally, we are seeing the return of vital services such as new local community care services.

So we could say, that Andamooka is bouncing back.

There is a mix of reasons for this, but there is no doubt a vibrant town does attract and retain residents. The creation of vibrancy, wellness and growth underpinned the objectives of the 2019-23 Town and Community Plan. All aimed at building resilience.

ARTY ANDAMOOKA CORNER EXPANSION OPENING UP NEW ARTS ACTIVITIES

There will be a new addition to Arty Andamooka Corner, which is located centrally on the corner of Christmas Hill Road and Opal Creek Blvd. Under a new lease agreement with the Lapidary Group and in collaboration with the Arts Collective, the 'Old Vets' building will be upgraded to accommodate mosaics, cold fire pottery and glass-craft, opening up more options for locals to exercise or learn skills, connect with others, and for local cottage industry to create more craft based self-employment for locals.





LAPIDARY PROGRAM: Expansion Underway

Undoubtedly the most popular hands-on attraction for locals and visitors to Andamooka, the Lapidary Workshed is expanding its program with jewelry making moving into the 'Old PO' premises and set to offer workshops for beginners to advanced, and to also house advanced stone-cutting activities.

Working in collaboration with the growing Andamooka Arts Collective, the program is also moving into creatively combining stone cutting with pottery, mosaics and glass-craft and this will be housed in the Old Vets building, set for an upgrade and located up from the Old PO on Christmas Hill Road.

The 'Lap Shed' is a great place for locals to meet to enjoy time with others and to connect with community. Also offering a great introduction to our traditional opal industry for new residents and visitors.

ARTS COLLECTIVE GOING AHEAD IN BOUNDS

This growing collective group of local artists represent a wide range of genres, encompassing canvas and collations, sculpture, fabrics, photography, digital, wood and metal work as well as jewelry and mosaics.

After three weeks on exhibit in the Andamooka Community Hall, Andamooka SALA 2023 has been touted as the most successful in terms of sales for our amazing artists. The exhibit looks stunning, attracting wonderful feedback from visitors who are impressed with how active our historic outback town is around the arts, and how broad our arts base is.

WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH YOUTH?

When planning, Youth asked for dedicated space to call their own to set up their games, with a store room. Access to an undercover modified multi-sport court. Also to a space with a big screen to play video games, watch movies, with internet for gaming and for homework assistance. Additionally, space to play and learn music, an undercover outdoor space to socialize and a secure toilet facility close by. They also wanted access to a kitchen for cooking and learning hospitality skills, and places to learn arts and crafts. All of this has or is in the process of, being put in place.

The aim was then for consultation with the kids together with parents/carers and others who might help with activities and supervision, to determine what activities youth and kids want, what equipment is needed, and how they want to set up the youth space.

So, Youth will run monthly drop-in family fun nights on the last Friday of the month to bring kids, parents, carers, and friends together with the new youth team, to put together a truly interesting and inspiring youth and children's program.

FAMILIES & CHILDREN:

The new Media Room will offer access to internet, laptops and audio-visual equipment opening up for new creative IT activities, also act as a gaming room & movie theatre for youth and families.

Once we pack all of that equipment away into secure storage, we have **space for kids to play** whilst parents and carers enjoy **wellness activities** or **playing modified sport** or maybe take **fitness classes**.

Families or groups can also enjoy booking space in the rec centre for casual sports fund or have a go at big-screen Wigames such as 10 pin bowling, Super Mario and more, or book the Media Room for family and friends movie nights. It's like having a home theatre.















MAINTENANCE REPORT

Work continues on maintenance and improvements currently including:







PLEASE BE A RESPONSIBLE PET OWNER

- Your dog must be registered by 3 months of age.
 Register via Dogs and Cats Online (DACO dogsandcatsonline.com.au) or call the Outback Communities Authority on 1800 640 542
- It is mandatory for your dog to be:
 - o microchipped by 3 months of age
 - o desexed by 6 months of age

(Exemptions apply. More information can be found at dogandcatboard.com.au)

- The registered owner of the dog must be a person 16 years or over
- Dog registrations are for one year and are renewable annually from 1 July
- A responsible pet owner ensures:
 - o their dog is not barking excessively or being a nuisance
 - o their dog is not allowed to wander or attack

LOOK OUT FOR SNAKES

Hot weather has bought out snakes & lizards so watch out for these creatures and make sure that you know what to do in the event of a snake bite.

This region is home to potentially deadly venomous snakes including the dark skinned Mulga and the Western Brown variations of which may be orange with a black head, or yellow head with greenish body, some have black bands. Don't confuse this with the harmless Desert Banded Snake which grows to only 40cm long, or the Ringed Brown which is venomous but not dangerous, growing up to 60cm.

A good practice is to keep a large, firm pressure bandage at hand in your car and home.
