Welcome to the APOMA committee!

At the 2023 AGM three new committee members joined with other enthusiastic serving committee members to foster change and vibrancy in our town, while respecting the rich history and culture of this unique community.

Lara Lukich

Lara is an avid long term Andamooka resident and instigated the Minne Berrington Project. This is Lara's first term on the APOMA committee. Lara grew up in Andamooka in the 1970s and 1980s. Her parents emigrated from Europe and settled in Andamooka after initially coming to town in the 1960s hoping to "strike it rich!" but it was the freedom they experienced that kept them on the field, and to stay and build a home.

In the 1970s, Lara remembers that while there was no television reception, movies were a highlight of the social calendar.

"Practically the whole town would attend the Friday night movie at the Community Hall, and the Saturday double feature at the Drive-In," she said. "My dad worked as a projectionist at both venues. I know my love of film and storytelling is because of those days."

Lara left in her early twenties to study graphic art and then drama interstate, but eventually the sense of community and the freedom of Andamooka drew her back.

Lara is passionate about our town's history and the Arts.

"This year through the APOMA committee I hope to facilitate the creation of the Andamooka History Group to protect, preserve and promote our rich history," Lara said.

Donna Waters

Donna Waters is of Kokotha and Kuyani First Nations decent with deep connections to Andamooka, Lake Torrens and surrounding country. This is her second term on the APOMA committee.

Donna's Great Grandparents lived and worked as boundary riders on horseback on Andamooka Station. Her father also ended up working on the Station and Donna has also worked on the station mustering cattle and fixing fences since her teen years.

"I learnt about the water system, repaired fencing, and discovered the ins and outs of the different locations to the area of this landscape before WMC had brought it," Donna said. "I still remember these locations when I go out on Country."

Donna works at the Roxby Downs Children's Centre, previously having worked at the Andamooka Primary School as a SSO and Library assistant.

Donna has been awarded back-to-back Young Citizen of the year, NAIDOC person of the year, and was recently Andamooka's long-serving Youth Officer.

Now back on the APOMA Committee and looking forward to bringing her passion for Indigenous heritage, protecting country, Youth, and Community to drive progress, the arts and native bush foods.

Corrie Ferguson

Corrie Ferguson moved from Roxby Downs to Andamooka last year with his wife and three children, drawn to the freedom and adventure of Andamooka as a place to raise a young family. Corrie who works for BHP at Olympic Dam is from a rural background and has lived and worked in remote WA, NT, and QLD.

In 2023 Corrie was on committees for the ASSA, the Roxby Downs Children's Centre, and the Roxby Downs Soccer Club.

He took part in the Regional Development Far North Leadership Development Program, an intense extension of the Committee Basics training he completed in Andamooka.

"I have always found myself in leadership positions in work and community"

Corrie said. "The skills and knowledge through this professional development opportunity will greatly assist me with my role on the APOMA committee.

I am interested in fostering local Youth and Community programs, maintaining and developing facilities, services and events." Corrie said.

Corrie looks forward to bringing together community members to harness their individual passion and drive for the town, region, opal, and tourism industries, to work united to achieve positive change for Andamooka this year and beyond.







I write to advise you of the immediate closure of the Andamooka Police Station. The station has not been staffed or operated since 2017, with police providing a response to the local community from Roxby Downs.

The permanent closure of the police station will not affect how the police maintain a presence or response in Andamooka, as the service has continued to have been provided whilst it has been vacant. The future response from Roxby Downs Police will include proactive patrolling of the community and responding to any calls for assistance.

It is intended to keep the former staffing position based in regional areas, but repurpose the role to continue to provide a high level of service to people in our regional communities.

Police stations will still be open in nearby towns for those who prefer to visit at station and speak to a police officer directly, or they can call Triple Zero or 131 444 for assistance.





LOOK OUT FOR SN

Hot weather has bought out snakes & lizards so watch out for these creatures and make sure that you know what to do in the event of a snake bite.

This region is home to potentially deadly venomous snakes including the dark skinned Mulga and the Western Brown variations of which may be orange with a black head, or yellow head with greenish body, some have black bands. Don't confuse this with the harmless Desert Banded Snake which grows to only 40cm long, or the Ringed Brown which is venomous but not dangerous, growing up to 60cm.

A good practice is to keep a large, firm pressure bandage at hand in your car and home.
