### DISSECTING THE TOWN FUNDING

### **MODEL:** The CARM Agreement explained.

First stage - review of the Agreement and associated budget.

Every March, as part of the process of adopting the OCA Community Asset & Resource Management (CARM) Agreement and the associated annual budget for the next financial year, the first draft of the Agreement is provided to APOMA to examine and to determine challenges within it, then to provide recommended adjustments for the next financial year. These are put on the table for discussion and explanation at the APOMA Open Member Meeting held in March, all community invited.

After which a motion for the Committee to progress negotiations with the OCA based on the outcomes of that discussion, is put to the floor for all present to indicate their support, and then voted on by the members.

Second stage – Community Consultation & presentation of the draft Agreement – First the Committee comes to an agreement with the OCA on a draft CARM Agreement and budget, which is then put out by the OCA to the Andamooka community for consultation across the month of May. APOMA is not involved with the consultation process.

At the end of the community consultation process, unless there have been objections raised which require further negotiation or discussion, the draft is then provided to APOMA for consideration as a final document for signing. At this point it is determined by the OCA that the community is in support of the Agreement and that they agree to the CARM budget as presented.

## Stage Three – determining management and execution of the CARM Agreement

APOMA committee, if satisfied this is true, take the community supported CARM Agreement and budget to the June Open Member Meeting, where it is presented for the members to vote on a motion for the APOMA Committee to take responsibility for the Agreement, and associated budget which is executed via the Town Office, reporting to the OCA, on behalf of the Andamooka Community.

Once passed, the members then vote on a second motion permitting the Committee to sign the Agreement for the Association to enter into the Agreement.

#### What's changing for the Future:

**New OCA funding model:** This proposed levy-based model has been going through the motions of consultation and legalities for the past 4 years. It is nearing completion and anticipated to be adopted by the end of 2026.

How will this affect Andamooka and the cost? Over the past 3 years we have been preparing for changes to the current community contribution scheme which will see more a regional approach to contributions and the distribution of government funding.

This not expected to raise the contributions significantly, but it will split the way we pay contributions by part being a levy applied regionally, and part like now, being a contribution paid by property owners and local businesses going towards town management, in particular to maintain services, but with less to cover facility maintenance and community programs.

How will maintenance and programs be funded? APOMA have progressively been moving towards a self-supporting approach for maintaining facilities and programs by adopting a user pay approach so that all users, local residents, participants in local programs and activities, and visitors to the town contribute towards the costs of maintaining and facilitating the facilities and programs, and for covering costs. The current challenge is to maximise use, hence increasing user pay contributions, offsetting those made by property owners and businesses.

Fundraising activities now being reinstated after the covid hiatus, will assist with upgrade projects and maintaining attractions, offsetting costs, and in turn will also serve to keep the community contributions at around current levels inclusive of the new levy.

#### **CARM BUDGET:**

What happens to the money we pay? Who says how it is spent?

It is actually a simple process. It is the community who decides via the CARM Agreement how the money will be spent. This is laid out in the budget attached to the CARM Agreement and this is available to the whole community as of April for consultation and feedback up until the end of May. It can be found on the OCA website and copies are available in the Town Office or can be emailed or posted out on request.

**CARM Town Management budget**: The Committee present the draft at in the March meeting with an analysis and an explanation of adjustments, also providing recommendations to take back to the OCA for negotiation.

Once negotiations are completed satisfactorily, the OCA finalise the budget and put that out for community consultation. Once the final agreement is signed off after the June meeting, the Town Office execute expenditure of town management funding in accordance with the budget, overseen by, and reporting to, the APOMA Committee and the OCA.

Association Budget: This is separate to the CARM budget. APOMA Association income streams resulting from APOMA facilities, programs, events, community grants and donations, is spent via the Association budget, also approved by members, with surplus funds expended or reserved at the committees discretion, but with a limit at which they must gain member permission to do so.

This is based on a fairer user pay system which means that all users, residents or visitors, contribute towards costs and maintenance.

The Projects budget: is separate to the others. This is for large grant funded projects and those funds must be expended as per the Grant Agreement for each. These funds are not available to the Association or Town Management budgets, or for other purposes or projects.

**Budgets 2024/25** - This coming year there are considerations around how to make the budget work best to the benefit of the community, but also meet significant cost rises in some aspects.

**Community Bus** – with the rise in costs for fuel, insurances and maintenance this budget ran at small deficit last financial year, but with a small rise in user donations this is anticipated to break even this year, but this needs review for 2024/25. Currently around \$7,000 has been accumulated in reserve funds towards a new bus.

**Town Insurances** – facilities and liability insurances – this has continued to rise significantly over the past 3 years. Up to 2023/24 this had been absorbed with some adjustment within the CARM budget, this year will necessitate moving a significant part of community program funding across to be covered under the Association budget. But with user pay contributing income towards these, it is anticipated that

generated income will offset costs. Contingency funds have been set aside to cover claim excess costs. This will need to be maintained.

**Power** – this is another cost which has seen a significant rise. However, power contributions applied to users of facilities will serve to offset the rise. Power is one aspect of the new funding model that is anticipated to become a challenge under the new arrangements and so will require constant review.

**Overall,** we anticipate that the CCS will not need to be increased for the next financial year.


