A motion was passed at the AGM to seek advice on the legalities of applying a fee to cemetery plots to assist with maintenance of this historic Andamooka icon which is popular with visitors and still in use.

Further investigation suggests that a fee can be applied towards maintenance and improvement of the cemetery. This will be raised at the ATMC meeting on 25 October with the view to putting the decision to the community for the implementation of a fee or contribution applied at the time a burial takes place.

Community feedback is invited on a draft strategy for managing the natural resources in the SA Arid Lands region over the next 10 years.

Released by the SA Arid Lands (SAAL) Natural Resources Management (NRM) Board in October, the draft *Regional NRM Plan –it's your place: a roadmap for managing, natural resources in the SA Arid lands region 2017-27* – provides guidelines for the planning, actions and investments of all communities. industries and government involved in natural resources management in the region.

The Plan shifts the focus from targeting individual assets – soils, plants, animals, water, industries, people, towns – to considering how these interact as a system, what is driving change to those systems, and the extent our systems are able to sustain how we work and play in the region.

The Plan also takes into account new research, policies and legislation, in addition to strengthening the regions response to climate change.

STORIES FROM OUR PAST

Early Information About the Andamooka Opal Fields *(from our historic records)*

Some of the names of the more permanent miners of the fields in 1932 were Sam Syrian, Jack (Wallaby) Hughs, Bill McCann, Punch Couts, Jack Freeman, Bert Wilson & family, Wally Hancock and Mr Hutchinson. There were many others who came and went.

Yarloo Field opened in the 1930's with Bill Hallion, Wally Hancock and Jack Freeman along with Ken Sharp and George Claughton. Only Jack Freeman found saleable opal.

Also in the '30's Boundary Rider Field opened, with Jack Hughes and Allan Treloar (the station storekeeper) doing the digging. Jack was a station boundary rider—thus the name of this area. Good black opal was found there in the 1940's and 1950's.

In about 1950, Jack Plisch, Don Clark and Den Khan went to Stuart Creek in Jack's 1925 Oldsmobile. There were just a few diggings on the flats and one old dug-out. They sank a number of shallow hoes around the hill (now nearly dug away) and found only bright blue/green opal. This was unsaleable in those days.

Later a number of men went out (one mob on Reg Absolam's 4-wheel drive Harmon-Harrion truck). They found some good vertical opal, plus a lot of beautiful red opal shot through with gypsum specks and holes. One buyer was caught with this stuff.

The country was very dry in those years and water very scarce, so little work was done at Stuart's Creek diggings until Peter Tilmouth went out there with his machinery.

FROM GOOLWA TO ANDAMOOKA by motor bike, the long way, raising money along the way for Andamooka community hospital.

On the morning of 23 September, 6 families departed Goolwa by bike heading for Andamooka. 7 days later, after travelling mainly along dirt back roads, through very challenging weather conditions , they arrived in town with a total of \$816.25 to donate to our community hospital.

FOSSICKING FOR FOSSILS

Andamooka Precious Stone Field contain a wealth of fossils if you know what to look for. There are fossils of shells, bones and vegetation dating back to a time when this region was a lush, inland sea environment.

Many fossils are either fully or partially opalised or embedded in rock formed from ancient sea beds.





A visit to the Underground

Opal Museum located below the Post Office will give you an idea of the fossilised treasures that have been unearthed in this region. The most significant local fossil find was a partial skeleton of a 6m long plesiosaur which is on display in the Adelaide Museum.

Most local miners have found fossils on their opal claims and many keep a collection of these fascinating finds. Some have discovered evidence of creatures not

thought to have existed in this region triggering scientists to reassess findings on the regions ancient life-forms.

So when fossicking for opal, keep your eyes open for fossils. Fossicking kits can be hired or purchased from the Post Office and you'll get some great advice on where to fossick.

However, make sure that you don't encroach or trespass on registered claims when fossicking. It is illegal to take opal from a registered claim as this is actually stealing hard-working miners property and livelihood.

LOOK OUT FOR SNAKES

Warmer weather has bought out snakes & lizards so watch out for these creatures and make sure that you know what to do in the event of a snake bite.

This region is home to potentially deadly venomous snakes including the dark skinned Mulga and the Western Brown which may be orange with a black head, or yellow head with greenish body, some have black bands. Don't

confuse this with the harmless Desert Banded Snake which grows up to only 40cm long, or Ringed Brown which is venomous but not dangerous, growing up to 60cm.

A good practice is to keep a large, firm pressure bandage at hand in your car and home. Call 000 for emergencies


