SA TOURISM COMMISSION VISIT VERY WELCOME

Andamooka, Roxby Downs and Woomera received a two day visit on 16-17th November from key representatives of the SA Tourism Commission (SATC). Pat Gobell, VIC Partnership Manager Destination Development, and Marc Leopold, Business Manager Industry Development, Destination Development, visited a wide range of tourist attractions and spent time with regional tourism representatives discussing local promotion and development.

The visit concentrated on Roxby Downs and Woomera on day one finishing the day off with a nocturnal tour experience at Arid Recovery.

On day two, accompanied by organiser Katalin Wilby representing the Business Development Focus Group based in Roxby Downs, and APOMA Secretary, Gill Rowley, our guests enjoyed breakfast at the AYC cafe before heading off

on a tour of mining operations taking in the view of Lake Torrens and a visit to Bill's Pub at White Dam. Then returning for a tour of the town including the Cemetery, Historic Cottages, community church, historic machinery displays, camp ground development, then on to the Underground Opal Museum before lunching at the renowned Tuckabox Hotel joined by Margot Duke and John Smirnios.

Over lunch local representatives discussed development and marketing plans around tourism with key points for local tourism being the development of trails, a visitor information point, development of tourist facilities and major event development and promotion.

Our local plans were well received with valuable advice on progressing them offered by both Pat and Marc.

Progressing Andamooka Town Development

FAREWELL AS THE ANDAMOOKA YACHT CLUB CHANGES HANDS:

As we farewell Matilda and Kurt, who have established a great town asset in the Andamooka Yacht Club (AYC) cafe, we will be welcoming another new young couple into the town who will be taking over the venture, reopening in late January 2017.

Many of you would have met Pip and Charlie, who have extensively travelled around Australia and love the outback. They bring new skills to the town and their experience in community programs will be of great value. Pip assisted with the community workshops in October.

APOMA will employ expert advice on a new licence agreement to put in place as of 1 July 2017 which better addresses community concerns and we encourage the community to welcome our new residents and to put their support behind the Cafe and their activities.

SATC VISIT cont:

Katalin has been instrumental in not only organising this vital visit, but also in the formulation of a regional tourism plan which also incorporates the townships of Woomera, Pimba, Glendambo.

The priority of the group is the development of a consistent approach to promoting the region including clear directional signage across the region and the development of a recognised 'Up the Middle' of the colourful heart of SA's outback' tourist route.

Both Pat and Marc were most impressed with Andamooka and keen to work with us as we develop tourism within the town & region.

COUNTRY CABINET VISIT TO OUR REGION:

APOMA committee members, Ian Thompson and Gill Rowley will join the forum at the Country Cabinet regional visit at Roxby Downs to raise awareness and discuss the challenges and needs of the Andamooka township and community, with the South Australian Government. The town's future sustainability will be the core issue raised together with proposed solutions and support needed to achieve this. Outcomes will be published in the December Newsletter.

PETER ALLEN RESIGNS FROM APOMA COMMITTEE

It was with regret that the APOMA Committee accepted the resignation of Peter Allen at the Committee Meeting held on Sunday 20th November. NEW APPROACH TO ACCOMMODATING YOUTH NEEDS:

STORIES FROM OUR PAST


REST IN PEACE BILL MacDOUGALL 'SHERIFF OF WHITE DAM' 23-3-1916 to 5-11-1989

“Today at 4.15am Mr William MacDougall passed away, peacefully, at the Royal Adelaide Hospital.

Harry phoned me at 9am & told me the bad news, I felt sad & had a cry, I continually kept thinking of Bill all day, & one thing he said to me has kept repeating itself, over and over, “*Girlie if I die tomorrow I have lived a full life! I have seen more of the World & Australia than a lot of people, & I’ve enjoyed my life!!*”

Bill, you certainly did live a full life & you have enriched thousands of other people’s lives, I know because I am one of them!

Now the Pub will be still, you won’t be there to tell your yarns & make people laugh. The tourists will no more have the eccentrically dressed ‘Sheriff of White Dam’ to tell their troubles to; you were a wonderful listener Bill. You will be missed immensely by many, many people from near and far.”

LOOK OUT FOR SNAKES

Hot weather has brought out snakes & lizards so watch out for these creatures and make sure that you know what to do in the event of a snake bite.

This region is home to potentially deadly venomous snakes including the dark skinned Mulga and the Western Brown variations of which may be orange with a black head, or yellow head with greenish body, some have black bands. Don't confuse this with the harmless Desert Banded Snake which grows to only 40cm long, or the Ringed Brown which is venomous but not dangerous, growing up to 60cm.



A good practice is to keep a large, firm pressure bandage at hand in your car and home.



FIGHT THE BITE, DAY & NIGHT

Protect yourself against disease-carrying mosquitoes.



There is currently **NO CURE** and **NO VACCINE** to protect against Ross River or Barmah Forest virus so the only way to protect yourself and your family is to avoid being bitten.

COVER UP: Wear long, loose fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothing including jeans.

REPEL: Use insect repellent containing DEET (diethyl toluamide) or picariden and always follow instructions on the label.

ELIMINATE: Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home.
