- The new APOMA business plan is progressing towards community consultation in the new financial year.
- A further \$100,000 in road funding has been approved for 2016/17 for a total of \$150,000.
- The ILUA agreement for Andamooka Precious Stones Field is nearing finalisation following a meeting with the Dept. of State Development.
- Insurance claim for repairs to storm damage sustained by the Church progressing.
- Permission has been given for the AYC to erect signage at approved public sites under specific conditions that will apply to other local businesses and organisations.

**NEW CARM AGREEMENT FOR ANDAMOOKA TOWNSHIP
MANAGEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT NEARING COMPLETION**

The new CARM Agreement for Andamooka 2016-19 has progressed. Managed by the Andamooka Town Management Committee (ATMC) which is a partnership between the Outback Communities Authority (OCA) and APOMA, together with independent community representatives and an independent chair, the Agreement sets the direction for administrating and developing the township including financials, facilities and services.

Much work has gone into formulating the 2016-17 ATMC budget which will be the first to be introduced following the 3 year ATMC inception period ending 30 June 2016. This will pave the way for the APOMA Committee to work progressively towards future improvements that will benefit the community.

**REGISTRATIONS AND RENEWALS OF MINING CLAIMS
NOW AVAILABLE 7 DAYS A WEEK AT POST OFFICE**

Under the new system which commenced 11 April, local miners are now able to lodge or renew a precious stones claim 7 days a week at the Andamooka Post Office.

The Post Office has a dedicated area set aside for lodging claims, open 9-5pm weekdays and between 11-3pm on weekends with a friendly staff on-hand to assist.

To lodge a claim miners will be required to:

- Fill in the relevant form - signatures will be scanned and checked as a security safeguard.
- The PO will fax to The Registrar for processing
- Payment can be made via credit card over the phone to The Registrar at Coober Pedy, or a you will be billed from Head Office with 30days to pay.
- The claim registration will be cancelled if payment is not received by the due date.
- Cash payments will be available at the PO once the procedure has been put in place.

Ashley Wood, Acting Registrar, Opal Field Program said that "Compliance checks will continue as before." Ashley is based in Coober Pedy and available for phone or email queries.

Original on display in the Community Hall

New plaque to recognize donor of the 'Big Matrix' at the Historic Cottages.

A dedication plaque has been installed by the RJCP group on the 'Big Matrix' which is on display at the Historic Cottages.

The plaque is in recognition of the donor of this massive matrix which was unearthed on 'Tea Tree Flat' by Andamooka opal miner Otto Zuna and donated to APOMA by Lucy Zuna.

Andamooka matrix (pronounced maytrix) is a unique brown sedimentary rock. Best quality matrix contains myriads of tiny deposits of gem opal and can be cut, polished then treated to produce an attractive and sought after stone that reflects the rainbow colours of crystal opal and is often used to make jewellery.

The Historic Cottages are open 7 days and entry is free.

OUR HISTORIC COTTAGES GET A FACELIFT THANKS TO THE WORK OF LOCALS FROM THE RJC PROGRAM

There is no doubt that the Historic Cottages are an iconic and special feature of Andamooka. These ramshackle structures line the main track, now known as Opal Creek Blvd, on the section that remains the hub of the township. These once lively abodes now rest peacefully in the shadows of mullock hills that resulted from endless hours of toil with nothing more than humble picks and shovels. They remain much as they were when built in the early 1930's by men and women, many of them migrants, searching for their fortune in the newly discovered Andamooka opal fields.

In what would have been an isolated and unforgiving environment, the cottages were designed to protect hardy miners and their families from the harsh elements and endless summer heat. Built primarily from locally gathered materials, their unique construction has withstood decades of harsh desert conditions. Tough mulga wood, rocks, stones, clay and whatever metal could be begged, borrowed or shipped in, was roughly nailed, tied or plastered together. Tiny windows were often covered only by a hessian sack which also served when wetted down, to cool the interior when breezes blew through the dampened fabric, but only when sufficient water allowed for this.



The cottage frontages face towards the morning sun and the usually dry creek bed, projecting outwards from what is in most cases a single room burrowed into the mullocks. These semi-dug-outs served to maintain a more stable inner temperature in which the miners would eat, sleep and store their goods and chattels.

To the credit of the builders, the cottages have withstood the ravages of the outback environment well, but they have been gradually crumbling. So over the past two years members of the community supported by APOMA and the RJC have worked tirelessly on restoring the cottages and environs as authentically as possible. Most recently the RJC workers have spent hours researching and sourcing the right materials to restore white-washed walls that not only blend perfectly with the originals, but which are tough enough to withstand the elements.

To create a realistic snapshot of living conditions at the time, members of the community have donated historic mining tools and equipment, cooking utensils, furnishings, and household gadgets, together with a myriad of amazingly ingenious innovations for all sorts of tasks.

Tables and benches have been installed adjacent to the cottages which are used for various local events such as the annual Camp Oven Dinner in August, cooked in much the same way as the miners would have made their meals.

Visitors are welcome to join the locals under a canopy of stars for this authentic outback dinner that reflects the flavours of the town's vibrant multicultural background, along with a range of favourite classic 'Ozzie' puddings. But we ask that they be mindful of the spirits that whisper through these timeless structures.



Nowadays, interpretive signs lead visitors on a journey through time and you can't help but wonder what stories these rough old walls could tell.

Q&A Session on Community Care Options raises several questions for Andamooka residents

Around 30 people attended a presentation and Q&A session at the Andamooka Community Hall held on the 5th April to introduce the new Federal Government My Aged Care program and Calvary Community Care program which have been initiated to support health and care services for aged, disabled and those requiring respite assistance or home care.

Most questions from the floor related to concerns with registering with the program and on-going contact particularly in emergency situations. There were some concerns with the proposed system which relies heavily on phone or internet contact and offers little personal contact for clients or carers. Many felt that it didn't seem to adequately address issues with the ability to use telephones and the internet, or with hearing difficulties and also with people for whom English is a second language.

There was also concern with clients contacting remotely based services that had limited knowledge of their patient history.

Another concern related to transport services, particularly for medical appointments, which has worked successfully in Andamooka in the past with the assistance of volunteer drivers.

Respite care was also discussed at length with several ideas mooted including the possibility of establishing a respite service within the local region.

Representatives from My Aged Care and Calvary Community Care were open to discussion towards creating solutions to issues and concerns raised and this will be followed up by the ATMC and the Remote Area Nurses stationed at the Andamooka Health Service towards achieving a functional and effective community care system for the residents of Andamooka.


