There is no doubt that Andamooka is at a cross roads and with so much at stake, it is vital that the community is actively involved in planning the direction the town now takes towards its future wellbeing.

The first open community forum in February introduced and gained support to progress a network of concept plans that link development plans in a coordinated manner around infrastructure, facilities, services, events, activities and various community sectors including seniors, youth and families as well as unemployed, and men's and women's health and well being.

Individual plans have been further developed within a 10 year extended plan. Funding is being sought for each together with the development of income streams to support their long term success and sustainability.

Also to further ensure this success and to assist the APOMA Committee with this big workload, a number of volunteer coordinator positions have

been created for various projects and programs and the committee is actively seeking locals to fill these positions or lend some assistance.

Andamooka was built on its volunteers, and today many of its day to day functions rely on volunteers.

Pleasingly, there has been a great response to the call and a number of people have offered their time and skills in vital positions and for various tasks, all helping to spread the load.

No matter how small you think your contribution might be, think of water dripping in a bucket... It is surprising how quickly the bucket will fill. So each small contribution helps.... and the town and community benefits.

Equally as important is your input and support for the plans for creating a great place to live and visit. So please put aside a couple of hours on the 26th and join in the Forum.

UPDATES ON WORKS & PROJECTS**COMMUNITY HALL:**

Roof repairs— commence in March for completion by the end of April.

TWO POWER OUTLETS TO BE INSTALLED AT THE CARAVAN & CAMPING GROUND :

In response to a number of enquiries about powered sites for caravans, APOMA is moving forward with plans to install two lockable 15amp outlets which should be operational by Easter.

PROGRESS WITH THE ANDAMOOKA DUMP AND CLEAN-UP: (OCA release)

Tenders have been called for the removal of surface asbestos between the Andamooka refuse pit and Lake Torrens Road.

Site inspections will be undertaken in the area during March by the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure Asbestos Management Unit to determine the scope of work required.

Work will include the removal of visible asbestos. The site will not be excavated and sub-surface asbestos will not be recovered. Appropriate exclusion zones will be established while remediation work is undertaken. *It is imperative that members of the public do not access the exclusion zones.*

An alternative hard waste set down area has been identified within the fenced area of the refuse site and is now operational. This area is sign posted and monitored. *Any illegal dumping will be reported and actioned.*

The public is reminded it is an offence to dump asbestos or asbestos containing items anywhere other than a registered asbestos dump.

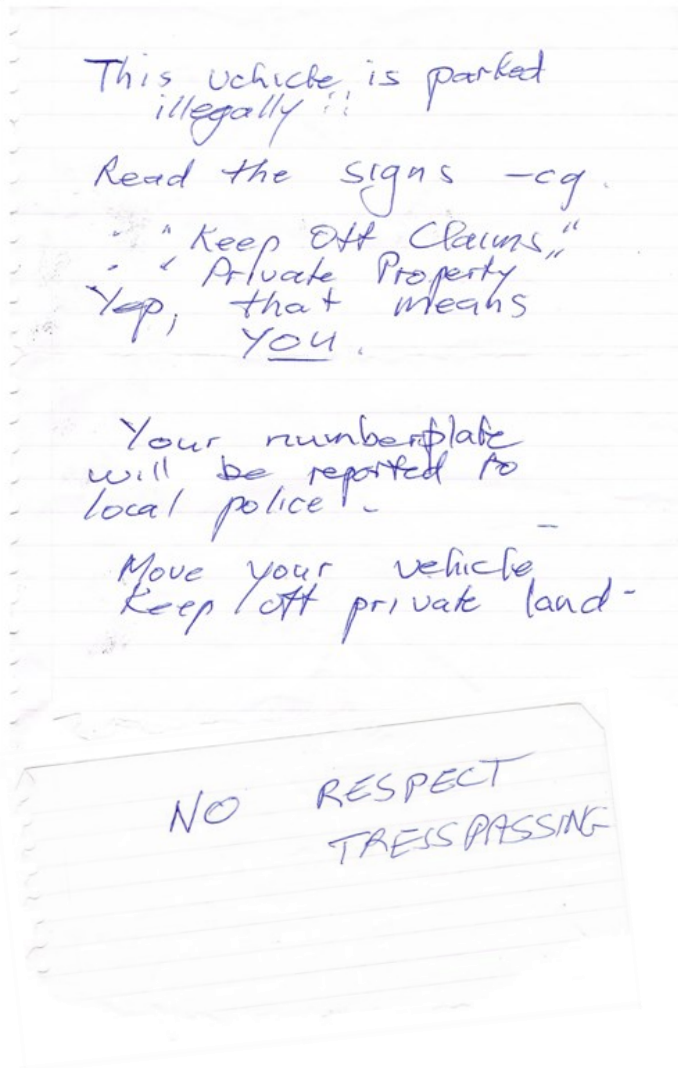

Ramsey Welcomes Rural Ministerial Taskforce

The Chair of the Federal Rural Liberal Caucus Rowan Ramsey MP said he is very pleased Prime Minister Turnbull has announced the establishment of a Regional Ministerial Taskforce to address key issues in regional Australia. The taskforce will be chaired by Prime Minister with senior Cabinet Ministers from across a range of portfolios relevant to rural Australians.

"Regional Australia has specific needs which are quite often very different to the city and we need to make sure that cabinet has the ability to focus on these as a priority," Mr Ramsey said.

"As chair of the Rural and Regional Liberal Caucus I invited the Prime Minister to address our meeting in the first week of Parliament.

"At that meeting, we stressed the importance of a strong regional focus and many regionally unique issues were discussed. The announcement now that the PM is responding by the establishment of this taskforce is terrific news.

"Our regions are responsible for almost three quarters of Australia's exports, the majority of Australia's production of gas and electricity, half the nation's tourism, and most of our food and fibre production.

"The Government needs to recognise the special challenges faced by regional Australians from employment to accessing health care, running a business, education and telecommunications.

"The Coalition collectively represents almost all of regional Australia and the importance of having a senior group of Cabinet covering all of the most relevant portfolios and chaired by the PM in getting this message through, cannot be overstated."

The Coalition Government has a proud track record of investing in regional Australia through the Building Better Regions Fund, investment in regional jobs and infrastructure programmes, telecommunications and appointing a rural health commissioner, it is important we continue to push for the recognition the regions deserve."
