### **UPDATE BOREFIELD ROAD EXTENSION & LAKE TORRENS ROAD**

### Great progress has been made on both road projects.

Eddie Hughes MP, Member for Giles, attended the Open Community Forum in June where he discussed the benefits to the town from upgrades and access for these roads and also issues relating to community care in Andamooka in detail.

In recognition of the value to tourism and the town's economy, he has actively pursued funding for remediation of the Lake Torrens Road with encouraging results. The Project has been directed to the OCA to assist with progress. More on this in the next newsletter.

### PROPOSED ROUTE FOR BOREFIELD ROAD EXTENSION



In late June a group comprising APOMA Committee members together with three informed members of the community and Kokatha Chairman Chris Larkin, took a 4WD reconnaissance trek of the proposed Borefield Road extension pinpointing GPS marks on a map to be submitted to Government via Eddie Hughes to progress this vital tourism link which will create a north/south loop road directly through Andamooka to and from the Stuart Hwy/Woomera/Roxby Downs and bypassing Olympic Dam operations.

### **ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY GARDENS PROJECT**

### The Andamooka Community Gardens Project has 3 major aims that will provide great benefits to the town:

1: to regenerate arid lands plantings that will beautify the township and create enjoyable recreations spaces, assist with alleviating raised dust and abating erosion of creek-lines and also provide habitat for beneficial insects and native fauna.

2: to educate about, propagate and plant out within their natural environment and in town gardens, plants that will provide bush foods and medicines which can be harvested by the community and create an opportunity for cottage industries within the town.

3: to develop community gardening space for members of the community to share gardening skills and experiences and to grow a variety of foods including fresh herbs, vegetables and fruits that can be shared and enjoyed by the community and assist with healthy eating.

Thank you to the Time for Wellbeing community health program who have provided a grant of \$5000 towards vital infrastructure for the Andamooka Community Gardens Project.

#### NRM FUNDING GRANTED FOR ARID EXPLORERS GARDEN AT COMMUNITY HALL

Funding of \$9800 has been granted to APOMA from SA Arid Lands NRM Board Community Grants, towards construction of an Arid Explorers Garden in the unused space at the western end of the Andamooka Community Hall.

The Arid Explorers Garden project was instigated by Pip and Charlie from the AYC Café who suggested the concept after visiting the Arid Lands Discovery Garden in Port Augusta. This stimulated discussion between APOMA, the Youth Group, AYC and the Andamooka School which has also won a grant towards a school garden which will integrate with the towns community garden spaces.

The major objectives of the interactive Arid Explorers Garden, which will beautify this currently wasted hub space, are to engage the community of all ages in learning about, planting out, caring for and utilising relaxing garden spaces and natural play areas surrounded by native plants that are descriptively signed with ID, care and uses including traditional culinary, household and medicinal uses, also providing the community with examples of plants that they can grow in their own arid land gardens in place of exotics.

Pip Stafford from the AYC has taken on the role of Project Officer and will be initially consulting with various community groups and organisations on their ideas and knowledge and encouraging their participation as we collectively put the final design of the Garden together. The Plan will be displayed at the next Community Forum on the sixth of August for comment, after which it will form the blueprint for construction and planting.

The Arid Explorers Garden will be a key feature of the Andamooka Community Garden Project which also extends to a community propagation program, a community shadehouse for growing fresh produce together with the CDP aquaponics project, and plantings of local native vegetation along the towns creeklines, pathways and in community spaces, including bush foods utilising knowledge from indigenous members of the community and a number of practiced arid land gardeners that have created successful home gardens in Andamooka.

Local contractors will be assisted by the CDP crew with the construction of the Arid Explorers Garden overseen by Richard Hawkins as Project Manager.


