- Meeting with group re proposed Community Swimming Pool
- OCA representatives in attendance. Pre-meeting discussion re 2018-19 budget.
- Brendan Weber has retired due to work commitments that prevent him from attending committee meetings. His valuable contribution to the town was recognized by the Committee.
- End of Month Balance for February at bank: Operations: \$29,9991 plus \$5500 CARM funding. Donations \$205. Savings acc: \$15,470. Independent half yearly report to end Dec17/Jan 18 showed a deficit of \$1007 leading into the next half year, in line with the budget deficit.
- Budget performance to end of Dec 17 discussed. Applications in process for grants for community hub and camp ground.
- Successful event on March 1st resulted in approx. \$1000 injected into the community hall revitalization project.
- Splash pad sensor not working properly. Timer to be installed to prevent waste of water and power.
- Easter weekend activities organised in conjunction with volunteers assisting.
- Next Open Community Forum proposed May to progress community projects and programs
- Town to be busy over April with visiting film and photography crews.
- Preparations discussed for Member Meeting 17 March.

Keeping Up With Business Progressing Andamooka Town Development

OUTCOMES FROM APOMA OPEN MEMBERS MEETING, SAT 17th MARCH

The meeting, attended by 20 financial members was called for the AREAS UNDER REVIEW FOR CHANGE: purpose of:

• presenting an overview of the APOMA budget performance to the end Dec 2017 and the draft budget for 2018-19 and how that could dovetail into the 2018-19 CARM budget,

• presenting the proposed changes to the APOMA Constitution to gain member consensus to progress with the view to adoption of the revised Constitution at the 2018 AGM.

Results for the APOMA budget performance to 31 Dec 17

Results showed a deficit of \$1290 inclusive of unexpected costs for outstanding pre-2017 projects which possibly mean that reserve funds from the savings account will be needed to balance this financial year depending on the amount of income generated over the next half year. A number of concerns were raised by the committee on the proposed 2018-19 CARM budget which they believed needed to be addressed before they or the community agrees to sign off on the 2018-19 CARM Agreement.

A consensus was passed for the Committee to proceed with discussion and negotiation with the OCA around the CARM Budget for 2018-19 and the implications around that, before proceeding with signing of on the CARM Agreement on behalf of the community.

APOMA ASSETS:

During 2017 the Committee undertook a full review of assets and insurances to identify and list the assets, then to review their values and insurance arrangements to ensure that the Association is not put at risk and that all assets are adequately insured.

An updated list of assets was distributed and a report together with recommendations to upgrade, dispose or hand over of some listed assets such as creek crossings, will be distributed to members and the community to consider prior to the 2018 AGM where the recommendations will be voted on.

Major Assets have been collectively valued at \$2,218,000 and this will be reflected in on-going financial reports.

PROCESS FOR CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION:

• STAGE 1: Support from members to review and revise the Constitution for modernisation and to reflect the current objectives of the Association. Agreed: 2017 AGM

• **STAGE 2:** Presentation of proposed changes to the Constitution at the General Meeting March 2018 for support to proceed with putting together a revised Constitution. **Agreed: General Meeting March 18**

• **STAGE 3**: Draft revised Constitution under expert guidance before circulation to members for scrutiny: **March to August 2018**

STAGE 4: Adoption by Members 2018 AGM - October 2018 with immediate effect.

STAGE 5: Registration of Revised Constitution

OBJECTIVES: -

to better reflect the role of APOMA as representatives of the Andamooka Community to Government and the OCA.

To better reflect the full scope of activities that APOMA facilitates within the community

• To better reflect the issue of economic development towards a sustainable future for the town

MEMBERSHIP:

Align the membership types with the definition of membership

Modernise and make clearer the procedures for membership application and eligibility.

Update due date from July to January

COMMITTEE:

Powers and Duties of the Committee –

signing of financial instruments to reflect modern payment methods via internet banking etc.

• value inserted in the empowerment of the committee to acquire or replace fixed capital assets. Recommended as \$10,000. (eg: if the hall air-conditioning breaks down and needs replacement)

- power of the committee to dispose of any fixed capital asset
- Definition of fixed capital asset to be added to Definitions.

Proceedings for Committee Meetings - Modernise to allow for attendance via telephone and for motions via email

which are done under strict procedures which will be set down.

GENERAL MEETINGS:

Changes as passed at the 2017 AGM to modernise and bring in line with requirements around auditing and presentation of annual financial statements.

Modernisation of member notices for general meetings to reflect the use of email correspondence.

• Correct eligibility for voting at general meetings with corrected definition of a full member in item 5.1

Modernise the keeping of Minutes records to reflect modern methods of record keeping and access.

DISPUTE RESOLUTION:

Seek legal advise on modernising the procedure •

FINANCIAL REPORTING:

As above

A motion to progress the changes to the Constitution was passed unanimously.

GRANT UPDATE:

The two small 'Smarty Grants' for the Portable Movie Screen and Portable Shade Canopies are in the process of acquittal as is the NRM 'Arid Explorers Garden' grant.

Submissions have been forwarded for funding from the 'Time for Wellbeing' program for assistance with the community "Mind & Body Wellness' program and also for community art & craft and wellbeing workshops. Also from the FRRR small regional grants to assist with a 4-way power outlet at the camping ground which will generate greater income to support maintenance & development of that facility.

PUBLIC LIABILITY – A 'NECESSARY EVIL'?

Over the past few months the issue of public liability has been at the forefront of organising & participating in APOMA community events. Public Liability can be viewed as a 'necessary evil', put in place to protect the Association from litigation and participants from suffering financial or asset loss due to unfortunate circumstances.

In 2017, during the process of rationalising and updating Association insurances, community assets and community activities and events, it became apparent that covering risks in these litigious times needed serious attention.

Consequently committee members met with our insurance brokers to work through & update cover for the Associations responsibilities, activities & assets, then to assess potential risks to ensure that the Association, its assets, activities and events are also covered for public liability in the event of an accident, incident or claim against them.

This necessitated a number of changes to insurance arrangements which were implemented late in 2017, most of which are upgrades to past arrangements and which have no direct impact on the residents and community. However, recently some community events and their participants have been affected by the changes.

It is not the day to day activities and events that are affected, nor APOMA volunteers and personnel, but it is the events that pose a risk either directly or indirectly that require additional cover to retain effective insurance protection.

Disappointingly, the planned Youth Billy Cart Derby became a victim of the times. APOMA was unable to secure public liability cover for the event. If available the cost would have been prohibitive and additionally would have required cover for the Youth Coordinator in her role as organiser. Also the requirements to set up and manage the course were very demanding. So unfortunately, this great historic Andamooka event had to be cancelled. However we will look to create a modified version that may allow for the event to go ahead.

Another requirement of the Association's public liability arrangement is to confirm that all food stall or market stall holders hold current public and product liability insurance. This protects both the Association from claim and stall holders from the potential cost of litigation. A number do have cover but most local stall holders don't, which could cost them upwards of \$250 per year to have.

So to make this vital insurance affordable to them APOMA took out a stall holders public and product liability insurance policy which participating stall holders can individually attach to on an event by event basis at a cost of around \$17 per stall holder. APOMA offers this service to stall holders at \$15 per event which results in a considerable saving to them and encourages their participation.

Things To See And Do In Andamooka...

Andamooka Observatory

Once a past resident in Andamooka in the late 80's and mid 90's, Conan Fahey together with partner Karyn revisited Andamooka a few years ago and came up with the notion of taking a few months break from their business interests in China and 'renting a place' in Andamooka. However, with property prices plummeting at the time due to Olympic Dam's expansion ceasing, they made an offer on a 'property with potential' and developed a plan to construct an astronomy observatory and viewing platform and to build a tourism business around that.

Their idea was to include a book shop that would help fund the development and to open at night and early in the morning for sky phenomena and cosmic events, and using it as a base camp for an 'opal miner for a day' and nocturnal tours. Supported by 'old mates', photographers & local miners they now host opal mining, astronomy and astrophotography presentations and sessions.

To celebrate the second blue moon in one month phenomenon over Easter, together with other astro-interested locals, Conan hosted what became locally known as the 'Moonie Night' with around 50 people including local families, visitors, members of the Andamooka School reunion group, and a visiting film crew, all getting a very clear and detailed view of this special event on the new APOMA portable outdoor movie screen.

All who attended agree that it was an amazing experience to get up close to this huge full moon within Andamooka's sensational star-scape transposed onto such a big screen and being able to track stars and constellations as they moved across the sky. Just to add to the effect, Conan lit up neon lights to flash across the mullocks that wrap around the observatory.

So, if your visiting Andamooka be sure to drop in, or if you're a local and haven't yet visited the observatory, take the next opportunity to experience space travel in your own backyard.

ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY GARDENS PROJECT

The Andamooka Community Gardens Project has 3 major aims that will provide great benefits to the town:

1: to regenerate arid lands plantings that will beautify the township and create enjoyable leisure spaces, assist with alleviating raised dust and abating erosion of creek-lines and also provide habitat for beneficial insects and native fauna.

2: to educate about, propagate and plant out within their natural environment and in town gardens, plants that will provide bush foods and medicines which can be harvested by the community and create an opportunity for cottage industries within the town.

3: to develop community gardening space for members of the community to share gardening skills and experiences and to grow a variety of foods including fresh herbs, vegetables and fruits that can be shared and enjoyed by the community and assist with healthy eating.

Thank you to the Time for Wellbeing community health program which has provided a grant of \$5000 towards vital infrastructure for the Andamooka Community Gardens Project and to the NRM for the \$9400 grant for development of the Arid Explorers Garden and also the community garden space at the Community Hall.

DROP IN AT THE HUB & BE PART OF THE COMMUNITY GARDEN BEDS & ARID EXPLORERS GARDEN there's a selection of herbs ready for picking!





A concerted effort by APOMA project manager, Richard Hawkins together with the CDP crew assisted by Pip & Charlie from the AYC and other volunteers, has seen the Arid Explorers Garden literally blossom with new planter box seats for the community to relax and enjoy the garden and a network of pathways and bridges integrating with indigenous plantings and creative spaces that will encourage small creatures and birds into the space.

There is still a little more to do to complete infrastructure within the space with the long hot summer impacting on safe work hours, but with a month's extension granted by the NRM to complete the project to sign off, the garden will continue to develop & grow into a wonderful community space.

We encourage all members of the community to visit and see the amazing transformation of the space and to take advantage of the delicious fresh foods growing in this cool, relaxing courtyard or to get digging' in the garden.

ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY HUB PROJECT

A concept plan for the layout of the new community workshop / kitchen, which is replacing the existing old storeroom at the rear of the Hall, was presented to the community at the February Open Community Forum and received great support from those present to move ahead with its construction.

Salvageable materials from the existing structure will be re-purposed into more efficiently designed storage space and a proposed carport to protect the community bus.

Deconstruction and ground work is anticipated to commence in May with the structure expected to be ready for fit out in August and functional well before the end of the year.

This new and much needed community facility has been made possible by funding received from an ANZ Seeds of Renewal grant via the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal which supports projects that support regional development, enterprise and sustainability.

The workshop will support a wide range of art & craft and healthy living workshops & activities to encourage all members of the community to enjoy new experiences and wider social engagement. Equally to encourage new cottage industry within the town and to regenerate interest in opal cutting and jewellery design. It will also support youth activities and will have correct lighting installed for fine skill activities such as needlework and quilting.

To allow for greater participation and expanded space to support workshop activities APOMA is applying for a grant to fund installation of flexible dividing walling that will effectively divide the hall into two primary and workable spaces, but which will have a variety of applications to support community activities and events.

These will be valuable in providing space for community body and mind fitness sessions for which equipment is being donated inclusive of a large TV to be installed on the wall donated by the Andamooka CWA funded by their Op Shop.

These projects will continue the revitalisation of the Hub space and will open the way for future projects to support other needs that have been bought to the attention of the Committee such as young children's enclosed play space and provisions for after school hours care to support and encourage more young families into the community.
