MOVING FORWARD INTO 2018-19

How quickly this last year has gone past! to participants or community groups. We now find ourselves moving into the next financial year, reflecting on outcomes been concentrated on: of the past year and busy working on a new budget and development plan to take us through 2018-19.

At the beginning of this past financial year we declared it the year of consolidation. We entered the year with some outstanding projects to complete and a list of priorities set by the community. At the top of that list was a communitý kitchen and workspace to support várious proposed programs and activities.

The wish list included lapidary workshops and workspace, establishing a community garden with aquaponics, youth activities including learning kitchen and cooking skills and a movie screen, a properly lit workspace for crafts such as needlework and glass crafts, and art, craft and historic activities and exhibitions featuring local artists and more events, with a plea to 'bring back the music'.

The committee also undertook with the community to create new and to improve existing, income streams that would feed back into community development for facilities & programs which would serve to create new business & employment opportunities and cottage industries. These in turn collectively build income streams, increase visitatión & encourage new residents creating a sustainable future for the town.

By installing availability to power at the camp ground ablution block, visitation has grown with a noticeable extension to the length of stays returning more into the towns economy. This in turn has allowed further investment into this facility with an additional 4 power outlets recently installed to meet visitor demand. Also, locating a café into the Hub provides a regular income stream into the facility to offset costs of services and maintenance contributing towards a well maintained and expanding facility for hire and to support more community programs & activities, often at no charge

Over the course of this past year work has been concentrated on:

- completing outstanding projects at the hall and hub & installing the street lights which we can happily say has been achieved with grant obligations met.
- Seeking interest in various activities with the greatest interest shown in lapidary/jewelry making, music events/ workshops, markets, indigenous foods, fitness activities and also bingo as well as quiz and movie nights. So developments & funding submissions have been aimed at meeting these community needs.
- Gaining funding and completing projects around the identified needs and equipment to facilitate programs and events. This has included the workshop/ kitchen, community garden, movie kit, shade shelters & wellness program.
- Meeting and working with various community groups around their specific needs now and into the future so that these are considered in development planning and when seeking funding.
- Bringing together and establishing working groups to ensure that events and programs have broad community participation & support & we thank all of the volunteers who have assisted in this regard.
- Keeping the community informed of issues, developments and outcomes, budgets and financials, and also giving them the opportunity to determine priorities, put forward their ideas and concerns and to ask questions around all of this through regular open community forums or via the town office.

Moving into 2018-19 there will be an open members meeting in August in which 'the community is invited to actively take part to discuss'& prioritise developments and funding opportunities, look at 2017-18 budget outcomes and to adopt the budget for 2018-19.

We urge your attendance.



Keeping Up With Business Progressing Andamooka Town Development

Outcomes from the Open Community Forum

PROJECT UPDATE - work has commenced on the new Community Workshop/ Kitchen. Bingo to raise funds for the kitchen fit-out.

BUS ANCHOR POINTS FOR YOUNG CHILDREN- to be followed up and installed.

CARM BUDGET- being followed through. Good support from OCA Board for proposed changes and ongoing negotiations around CCS issue.

HUB DEVELOPMENT-multi-functional/multipurpose will need user agreements in place to avoid conflict.

COMMUNITY PROGRAMS – new fitness group due to start in June as part of community Mind & Body Wellness program which will include a variety of health & fitness workshops. New music group starting up based in old PO building.

HOW MANY PEOPLE ON MY STREET?

Government statistics indicate that Andamooka has a population of 250 residents. However PO traffic indicates that it is more likely over 400. APOMA estimates that the population may currently be closer to 500.

Population affects funding & government support for services such as police, aged care & health. So it is critical that we get a qualifiable true estimation of our population.

YOU CAN HELP! By offering to count the residents just in your street. It doesn't have to be exact & we don't need names or details. Just the number of occupied houses & how many adults & children reside there. We can then collate the information which will give us sound figures to assist with services and funding for the town.

Proposed Community Swimming Pool

During April/May members of the community were invited to respond to a questionnaire to gain an indication of community support for a community swimming facility. 31 people responded with unanimous support for the pool, the majority preferring it open seasonally over the months extending from October to April on a daily basis. The full results were presented at the forum. John Smirnios, spokesperson for the pool project team, gave an overview of research to date on a fibreglass pool approximately 15mx5m together with costs, requirements, funding & sponsorships, management and other ideas around the facility.

The proposed location is at the Andamooka Camp Ground in the vicinity of the playground & amenities. Some community members have indicated that they would prefer to see a pool located more centrally near the hub space. However, the rationale of locating a pool closer to the town water point, near to an existing enclosed playground, undercover community BBQ and public toilets, and in an area where power is available and which is easily accessed with adequate parking space was supported by those at the forum.

It was also determined that as the pool would not be open over the prime tourist season it was unlikely to impact on visitors but may in fact attract greater visitation over the off-season hotter months.

The next stage of this project is to display a concept sketch plan of the pool/facility for a period of around one month to give the community the opportunity to provide feedback or to ask questions prior to the plan and location being presented at an open members meeting to enable the project to go ahead. The concept plan will also include a scope encompassing an outline of the proposed facility, the stages of the project, management strategy, services, regulations and costs together with anticipated sponsorship and funding and an outline of on-going requirements and costs. That will ensure that the community can make informed decisions around this major community project.

Thanks goes to the 'Community Pool Facility' project team for the great work done to date. With summer less than 5 months away they will be busy moving the project forward to the next stage.

GRANT UPDATE:

The 'Smarty Grant' for the Portable Movie Screen has been acquitted and the Portable Shade Canopies grant is due. The NRM 'Arid Explorers Garden' grant has been successfully acquitted.

The 'Time for Wellbeing' submission successful with funds allocated to the community "Mind & Body Wellness' program including the social fitness activities at the community hall.

Grant applications submitted for FRRR small regional grants to assist with additional power outlets at the camp ground. Also an AMSA submission for fit out of the community workshop. Currently working on grants to support the new community music program.

Since establishing there is a lot of interest in getting a lapidary program up and running for teaching & practicing opal/stone cutting & polishing with that extending into jewelry making, we have been busy looking for the right venue to house this.



ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY GARDENS PROJECT

The Andamooka Community Gardens Project has 3 major aims that will provide great benefits to the town:

1: to regenerate arid lands plantings that will beautify the township and create enjoyable leisure spaces, assist with alleviating raised dust and abating erosion of creek-lines and also provide habitat for beneficial insects and native fauna.

2: to educate about, propagate and plant out within their natural environment and in town gardens, plants that will provide bush foods and medicines which can be harvested by the community and create an opportunity for cottage industries within the town.

3: to develop community gardening space for members of the community to share gardening skills and experiences and to grow a variety of foods including fresh herbs, vegetables and fruits that can be shared and enjoyed by the community and assist with healthy eating.

Thank you to the Time for Wellbeing community health program which has provided a grant of \$5000 towards vital infrastructure for the Andamooka Community Gardens Project and to the NRM for the \$9400 grant for development of the Arid Explorers Garden and also the community garden space at the Community Hall.

DROP IN AT THE HUB & BE PART OF THE COMMUNITY GARDEN BEDS & ARID EXPLORERS GARDEN - there's a selection of vegies and herbs ready for picking!

Andamooka Primary School students took part in a BHP Billiton promotional advertisement about the company's support in SA communities which will air



nationally. Our community garden received \$5000 funding towards the planting bed extension, shade cover, benching for propagation/preparation and the stairs that connect the garden to the school. The students plant out and care for vegetables which they later learn to



prepare for healthy meals. Their produce is there to share with the community and they would love to see more people picking and enjoying their efforts.



This amazingly beautiful wall of natural Western Myall is under construction by the CDP crew at the western end of the Community Hall. Once completed it will protect plants and visitors in the Arid Explorers Garden from reflected heat and glare. The gracious and slow growing Western Myall, seen throughout the region is a protected species and is estimated to live for over 800 years. It has exceptional pest repellent properties and is of significance to indigenous peoples.

ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY HUB PROJECT

A concept plan for the layout of the new community workshop / kitchen, which is replacing the existing old storeroom at the rear of the Hall, was presented to the community at the February Open Community Forum and received great support from those present to move ahead with its construction.

Salvageable materials from the existing structure will be re-purposed into more efficiently designed storage space and a proposed carport to protect the community bus.

Deconstruction has been completed and ground work is underway with the structure expected to be ready for fit out in August and functional well before the end of the year.

This new and much needed community facility has been made possible by funding received from an ANZ Seeds of Renewal grant via the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR) which supports projects that support regional development, enterprise and sustainability.

Once operational the workshop will support a wide range of arts & crafts and healthy living workshops & various activities to encourage all members of the community to enjoy new experiences and wider social engagement. Equally to encourage new cottage industry within the town and to regenerate interest in opal cutting and jewellery design. It will also support youth activities and will have lighting installed for fine skill activities such as needlework and quilting. There are plans to set up Men's Shed activities too.

Further funding will be sought to install a flexible dividing walling that will effectively allow the main hall to be divided into two primary spaces but have flexible applications to support a variety of activities and events.

These projects will continue the revitalisation of the Hub space and will open the way for future projects to support other needs to encourage more residents and young families into the community.



Moving forward with deconstruction of the leaky old store room. The old wooden framework will be replaced by metal and the structure will be enlarged by around 1m in length and 1.8m in width. The rear opens up into the community garden space and a side awning will open into the courtyard.

The image below provides a perspective to how a new storeroom will be constructed on the eastern wall from materials repurposed from the old storeroom and will extend into a carport to provide shade and undercover protection for the community bus. The small rainwater tank visible has been moved across and reconnected, just in time for the rain!



ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY HALL – the secrets of this structure will amaze you

This imposing structure has a rather colourful history which is gradually being exposed through work being done on the Hall's indoor history wall together with other great stories from our past.

Often referred to as our 'glow in the dark' hall the building, once an officers mess hall, was manually deconstructed and transported cross country from the deserted Maralinga combined forces base by a determined band of Andamookans in the mid 70's, following the demise of the first hall built in 1962 which burnt down in 1975.

The aluminium clad Hall was then rebuilt by volunteer labour and officially opened by the Hon. Graham Gunn MP on 6th October 1979 and

it went on to host many wonderful events ranging from school concerts to the famous Freekah's Ball.

As the halcyon days of opal mining gradually receded so did the hall activities until by the turn of the century this amazing building sat silently basking in the desert sun with very few events taking place within its walls.

Starting around 2009 and progressively gaining momentum, there has been a determined revival underway by the local community to bring the hall back to life and to revitalise the surrounding hub space through new projects, events and community programs, working to encourage both locals and visitors alike to get involved with events and activities ranging from art and historic exhibitions to workshops, healthy living activities and social support groups, together with a thriving and expanding community garden and a new workshop/kitchen to support a whole range of activities and emerging cottage industries.



Andamooka has a great arts community so plans include more music, film events and live theatre together with a move to get locals back into opal cutting, polishing and jewellery making as well as other arts and crafts which will lift the town's vibrancy and economy.

There is now a café, a splash pad and a community book exchange which visitors are also encouraged to utilise. The youth group has their headquarters there, and a new musos' group is being formed with the aim to use the spaces in and around the hall for informal 'jam' events open to everyone as are new Sunday social games afternoons.

In line with community feedback, as the new spaces are created they will support the development of more community programs adding new and popular past events to the town's events calendar, also introduce men's shed activities and more for families, young women, seniors and youth to encourage more cross generational and group interaction and skill sharing.

The Community Hall belongs to all Andamookans, and as it moves towards its 50th Anniversary in 2019 we celebrate

a legacy created by a group of intrepid pioneers who undertook what would seem an impossible task and pulled it off with typical Andamookan flair so that their families and friends had a place to gather and share, a place of love and laughter & no doubt the occasional drama.... a place where badminton and table tennis competitions were won and lost, and home to some great past events.



So locals and visitors alike should take heed of that spirit and take the time to drop in, to join in activities, to enjoy the gardens, chat with visitors and meet with locals face to face... just be part of the buzz.

Progress with facilitating a program of regular user groups at the Community

The Committee is working to have a community hall regular user agreement in place for this much needed activity to commence as soon as possible. The first of these will be for a community social fitness group and for the Andamooka Youth Group.

With new spaces within the complex under development and the expectation that we will see more demand on those, APOMA has been working to create a 'Regular User Agreement' for community user groups who wish to book hall/hub space on a régular

In general, these Agreements will be put in place with the aim of giving clear parameters of use to all regular user groups to assist with smooth operation and to prevent any conflicts arising.

The Youth Group and social fitness group will be the first to hold such agreements with the new fitness group starting under an interim agreement up to the end of 2018 as work is completed on extensions and new regular programs are introduced.

The Youth Group is basically established, so to assist setting up the social fitness activities the Committee met with representatives of the group on Tuesday 29th May, to work through the group's proposed times for use and space requirements, with the intention of this put to the Committee for approval at their ordinary meeting on 12th June. On-going these agreements will remain flexible in approach to allow for development of those and other programs.

Currently there is interest from the new Muso's Group, and for needlework, lapidary and glasswork/craft on a regular basis and also for social badminton nights.

For any use outside of agreed limits regular user groups will work with APOMA to accommodate those as well as for any proposed changes to the agreement.

Bookings for one-off or occasional activities such as master classes, workshops, events and so on will be subject to availability but APOMA will do its best to work with all concerned to make these happen.

The committee have also undertaken to facilitate the fitness group with tea/coffee making and refrigeration for drinks, snacks etc, firstly with temporary arrangements and later via a shared space designed for this purpose which is part of the current workshop/kitchen project. Also to help with such things as photocopying and promoting their activities.

A primary consideration for all user groups is the declared 'Open to Public' hours of the main Hall space which was set after consultation with the Community at between 9.00am to 3.00pm to encourage greater social interaction between the community and also to provide a point of interest and relaxation for visitors to the town.

New spaces will open up greater access and multi-use opportunities. In the meantime this does not prevent bookings for activities during public hours which will be considered by APOMA and facilitated as best as

The Hall, courtyard and community garden spaces are generally open to the whole community 6 days per week between 9am to 3pm with front of house access to the book exchange and courtyard and soon to a public wi-fi arrangement which will also facilitate youth homework nights as well as community internet workshops.

The Hall hosts a growing number of community activities and events. We are building our history wall and arts revitalisation program which will include exhibitions and new arts based activities. So we anticipate that we will see increasing community and tourist visitation to our Hub, so we encourage activities that are 'open to all' during these hours.

Over the past two months there has been a number of break ins reported to police and various items stolen from houses. Can I ask that everyone please stay vigilant and







