KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS

OUTCOMES OF REVIEW & NEGOTIATION FOR 2019-20 CARM AGREEMENT:

As undertaken with the community, the APOMA Committee, assisted by a number of local service contractors have worked through a review of the municipal needs of the town and the costs associated with keeping the town well managed, facilities and roads well maintained, the dump operational, the best way to contract that work, and also reviewed facilities needed to support community activities, income streams and wellbeing.

This year we have taken a different approach towards keeping the OCA more accountable, by working to a joint quarterly review of how the CARM Agreement and budget is performing. This provides the committee with the opportunity to negotiate change if the need or opportunity arises, or to review continuing with the Agreement should there be concern around it no longer working in the best interest of the community. Additional funds have been negotiated as well as the promise for more involvement in the funding and budget process.

An in-depth review has been conducted of the processes around the CARM Agreement and how that can best work in the community's interests. Outcomes have formed the basis of the 2019-20 budgets and provided rationale to support negotiations with the OCA towards achieving a better bottom line for funding this financial year. Those outcomes are reflected in the new Business Plan 2019-23 which will be actively consulted on with community.

The Committee carry the unenviable task of determining whether they act in the best interests of the community when, after spending substantial time and effort year by year to research and negotiate the best possible outcome for town funding and producing an achievable budget for the town, they are tasked with taking their proposals and recommendations for the next financial year back to the community for a decision about signing off on the CARM Agreement.

Essentially, this group of volunteers carry the responsibility of building a sustainable future for the town. How this has been progressing constructively under the APOMA management plan, 2016-20, is illustrated in the positive budget outcome for 2018-19 and the proposed 2019-20 budget.

This year's decision comes at a time when the town is experiencing population growth, creating greater demand on town resources. Critically, this pressure on resources includes the group of volunteers who have the responsibility of maintaining, managing and developing the town and its facilities. Also for putting in place a platform of facilities and services to support community programs, local business opportunities, increase tourism and serving to attract new residents. We are well down the road towards this.

With this real prospect for a sustainable future, now is the time to decide what <u>you</u> would like to see for the future of our town. Take a look around to see what, over time, a small bunch of volunteers who have put their best efforts in to work within tight limitations, have managed to achieve and what the vision is for the future.

As undertaken, committee have sincerely worked to keep the community informed in regard to developments through regular meetings and the newsletter. Also to actively encourage community participation in consultation relating to the CARM Agreement, and further to present for response by the OCA, a list of questions that we have noted from meetings and discussions with community members. In fairness, it cannot be said that members of the community have not had a fair and reasonable opportunity to express their concerns, views and ideas, or that any of those that have been registered with us have not been raised for attention.

COMPLACENCY... has been the greatest hurdle to overcome. There is a 'silent' community populous who have shown that they are generally happy to contribute and with how the town is being managed, and others who have varying opinions.

So we invite the community to attend the AGM and be informed around what has been discussed and negotiated in regard to servicing and building a future for our town, to participate in discussion and to contribute constructively to the decision-making process around the CARM Agreement.

GRANT UPDATES

Work is progressing on the Grader Shed upgrade with power now connected and the next stage is to concrete the floor to acquit the grant by end August.

Divider walls have arrived with some in place for SALA. Planning commenced on the storage space.

Easternwell Grant for the C&C Ground shelter has been acquitted.



Can I burn plastic and other household rubbish?

No, burning plastic, household rubbish, tires, treated timber and listed wastes (Schedule 1 Part B of the EP Act) is prohibited under the Air Quality Policy.

Backyard burning in Andamooka is reportable to the OCA and people breaching the policy can be subject to a fine.

Remember that no open fires other than gas or electric are permitted during the fire ban season & on a total fire ban day without a schedule nine permit.

GRADER SHED UPGRADE POWERED UP

Funded by the Stronger Communities Program, upgrading the old grader shed to accommodate a town works facility is well underway. Grid power has been connected with volunteer help for trenching and power installations in place to service the benches and work-stations. Thank you to those volunteers who provided the excavator and labour for the job.

Work has commenced on clearing the floorspace ready for concreting and we are calling on volunteer assistance to help with this tedious job.



There are plans to hold a clearance sale of surplus items so watch out for this being advertised towards the end of the month.

The upgraded facility will also be utilised for community woodwork and metal work workshops to encourage more cottage industry in the town.

RECORDS STORAGE UNIT INSTALLED AT THE TOWN OFFICE

Now that construction of the community workshop has been completed to fit-out stage, the donated secure shipping container has been put in place behind the Town Office thanks to donated time and crane hire by Monadelphous Engineering.

This opens the way for volunteers to put our historic records and special items in clean, safe and secure storage as well as housing the office records to create more workspace in the Office.

LAPIDARY PROJECT SPINS INTO GEAR 2019-20

With 24 people already registered to learn the art of stone cutting and polishing, we can't get this facility set up quickly enough.

Every opal is unique, not one the same as another and so each needs to be treated and approached differently to bring out the best colour and quality. This is a great opportunity for locals and visitors to share skills and to learn how challenging and rewarding working with Australia's iconic national stone is.

Once underway there will be regular workshops for beginners to advanced, as well as field trips for learning to fossick and to see how opal mining is done.

Other workshops will include jewellery making and other ways of using opal, matrix and other local gemstones for saleable items. Also, short courses on retailing your wares.

Future plans are to commence formal lapidary courses for those who may be looking for qualifications, or to set up as a cottage industry, as well as for jewellery making courses.

The Lapidary Headquarters will be located adjacent to the community hub in the current town workshop when the workshop has been relocated to the old Grader shed, currently undergoing an upgrade. That will accommodate a municipal works hub and also woodwork and metal work facilities for locals to learn new skills or to utilise their talents, to produce saleable items and building arts based cottage industry in Andamooka.

Cottage industry will in turn serve to attract greater visitation with many tourists seeking to purchase one-off and locally produced art and craft.





Professionally curated by Yvonne Dalton, the exhibition showcases a wide variety of local artistic




