APOMA Committee 2019-20.

Following elections at the AGM in early August two new members joined the APOMA Committee, and Officers for the Association have since been elected by the committee for the year 2019-20. Two in-coming officers will hold acting officer positions for a three-month hand-over process.

Chairman, Peter Allen brings many years' experience to this role and he will be well supported by Vice Chair, Donna Waters whose valuable contributions to the committee over the past two years have been much appreciated. Rodney Mitchell is stepping into the role of APOMA Secretary and Keith Bartram is taking up the position of Vice Treasurer to support Treasurer Gill Rowley as Ian Thompson stands down from this position due to work commitments, but remaining on the committee.

Other members on the committee are Julie Franklin, Anthony Johnson, John Smirnios continuing, and new to the committee is Ron Ashenden who has many years' experience in local government including with building development which will be of great value to the committee.

The committee meet monthly and a new schedule of meeting dates for committee and for member/community meetings has been developed to assist a more coordinated approach to management and information sharing and dissemination works across both the Association and the community. Commencing in November, there will be regular quarterly shared OCA / Committee review meetings which will assist with planning around CARM funding and development.

The Committee is supported by the Town Office which provides a first line of community contact for the committee and for APOMA and town business. Office personnel work as a team which includes administration manager, Gill Rowley; project and maintenance manager, Richard Hawkins; administration, publications and marketing support, Emma Morris; and fundraising and events coordinator, Tanya Simpson, who also assists with community liaison.

The office team share 38 paid hours per week and together they generally complement the shared workload with equally as many, if not more, volunteer hours each week. The office roles and responsibilities are developing along with the town management model as expectations of what the office provides continue to grow.

The next Open Member / Community meeting will be held in mid-November following the first shared quarterly review meeting between the OCA and the Committee, where outcomes and a progress report from the review meeting will be presented and discussed with the community.

KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS

APOMA COMMITTEE LAUNCHING INTO A CHALLENGING 2019-20

In line with the 2016-20 Management Plan, which has created a stable foundation for the town to move forward, the Committee is busy preparing to introduce a new business and development focussed 'Andamooka Town Plan' to take the Town head on into the future, aimed at creating a progressive, dynamic and sustainable economic platform for our community to build businesses and lifestyles upon and to thrive from.

The end of 2018-19 found the Town in a sound financial position with steady growth in existing income streams and emerging new income streams which, as they develop during 2019-20 will deliver the benefits of a broader income base providing additional funds for the town and community without putting greater pressure on property owners.

Maintenance schedules are up to date, assets up to regulation with insurances in place, contracts in order, projects running in line with schedules, and grants meeting obligations. Importantly funds are being put into 'futures' for replacements and major repairs for our equipment and facility assets, including the community bus which is scheduled for replacement within 2 years.

This balanced position has been achieved by dedication, determination and the investment of many volunteer hours by the APOMA Committee and the Town Office crew. This positive outcome has opened the way for new community-based developments and will increasingly encourage emerging business and employment opportunities, providing certainty to encourage philanthropic support and investment into the town from major industry.

Andamooka is currently on the cusp of expansion and we predict that the residential population will reach a sustainable 700 by 2023. We estimate that it is currently at around 450 and moving steadily towards 500 by mid-2020 which goes against the current downturn trend for many regional and remote townships.

Already Andamooka finds itself too large to fit comfortably into the Outback Communities Authority management model, and although fiercely independent, it is too small to function as a local council. So, we as a township face an interesting challenge of developing a 'hybrid' town management model that is well supported by the residents. As a community we are entering interesting times in this regard.

The new Town Plan will act as a blueprint to address future challenges for the town, especially developments that will meet community needs of an expanding and demographically changing population moving from a predominantly aging population, re-balancing to incorporate more young families.

GRANT UPDATES

The Stronger Communities Programme grant for upgrading the old Grader Shed to a Town Workshop Facility has been acquitted now that the power has been installed and floor concreted.

This allows for progressing work to upgrade the 'CDP Shed' into a lapidary workshop and work will commence end of the month.

SA Medium grant to install storage and mobile dividing walls in the hall to assist multi-use of the spaces is progressing.

Grant opportunities to assist with fitting out the Town Workshop Facility are being explored.

KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS

It will create a dynamic 'big-picture' development plan which takes into account, maximising existing structures and re-purposing them to not only facilitate current needs but to also preserve their historic value and to maintain the character of the town.

Importantly the Plan also encourages the creation of consultative groups including a commerce-based group open to local business operators to address needs and challenges for local business and new local industry, and will explore expansion and training opportunities and cooperative advantages such as in marketing and investment.

A proposed events focussed group will collectively work on developing, supporting and managing a calendar of major events, and seeking sponsors and beneficial partnerships as well as encouraging participants and cooperative marketing strategies to maximise benefits and returns.

The emerging arts development group will work in sync with both, which will encourage local artists into seeking opportunities through events and/or cottage industry, and this will work hand in hand with opportunities around an emerging bush foods industry.

This approach will help broaden community involvement across the board and will ensure that developments and services are determined and managed with wide-ranging community input and support.

However, this approach can only succeed if individuals and factions come together and are prepared to share their ideas and energies, and to maybe compromise a bit from time to time, but most importantly to work together constructively towards shared goals and long-term vision. *So, let's all focus on a future for Andamooka, put aside differences, open our eyes to new opportunities, and rev up the spirit of the 'last great act of defiance' that we are famous for.*

BUDGET 2019-20

This year we are taking a new approach to financials and to presenting the budget reports so that community and APOMA funds are more separate, and this will make it clearer to the community where CARM funding is being allocated and how it is being spent and managed.

This new approach to financials will allow us to take better advantage of GST returns to the benefit of the community and will also show more clearly the considerable donation of funds into the community from APOMA, which occurs on an annual basis.

The new approach is in the process of being set up and so the first 'new look' budget report is planned to be published in the October newsletter and will be presented and explained at the open meeting in November, together with a financial report for the first quarter for 2019-20.



FROM GRADER SHED TO TOWN WORKSHOP PROJECT FINISHED READY FOR FIT-OUT.

Thanks to funding from the Stronger Communities Programme supported by local MP, Rowan Ramsey, the old grader shed has been upgraded with power installed and a commercial grade concrete floor, and is now ready to be fitted out with dedicated metal work and wood work spaces as well as storage space for various items including outdoor seating, large items for events and project materials.

The workshop will be progressively fitted out and will be multi-functional with





having power connected to the facility.

Without this in-kind assistance this project would not be possible.

Also, thank you to the local businesses who have supported the project including Northern Engineering & Earthworks, Andamooka Power House, Mossy Electrical and Michael Petkovic, also the CDP for their amazing dedication to the project.

The next stage for the project is to move the CDP out of the centrally located workspace into their new 'headquarters' so that facility can be upgraded into a functional, well-equipped lapidary workshop and headquarters for the new Lapidary Program, which has around 25 people waiting to get started on learning or perfecting their stone cutting and polishing skills to become part of Andamooka's revival of our opal industry culture and of our growing business and cottage industries.

THINGS TO DO AND SEE IN ANDAMOOKA

TAKE A VISIT TO THE ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY GARDENS

Centrally located in the surrounds of the Andamooka Community Hall including the amazing Arid Explorers Garden, great for kids to investigate and play within this arid-land environment filled with indigenous plants which are edible or useful for medicinal or domestic purposes, so visitors and locals are encouraged to take a sample of the native herbage and try out with their cooking. The saltbush makes a wonderful accompaniment to lamb, fish or chicken and the native 'pig-face' adds a succulent crunch to salads.

Food producing beds border the rear shady courtyard where the sheltered environment



allows for year-round production of tomatoes and salad greens. There is a seasonal variety of herbs including Asian and Mediterranean as well as spinach. Just now the grapevines are greening up for their summer crop also providing cooling shade throughout summer.

The Community Gardens then flow on throughout the township as a collective of bush foods are progressively planted along tree lines and creek lines and also within the Town Park which offers a quiet, green haven with

stunning sunset views, a welcome shady rest spot for walkers and is the community gathering spot for occasions such as ANZAC & Remembrance Day services.

Over the next year the Andamooka Greening Project will fund the first stage planting of our bush food orchard with edible wattle-seed trees that will form the underground fabric for planting sandlewood and parasitic quandong trees which rely on the root systems of other trees to survive.

Once our bush foods are established and thriving, these will support our emerging bush food cottage industry and provide opportunities for locals to establish small business concerns around bush foods and cosmetics.

So, although these plantings and gardens provide a cooling, greener living environment, they will also critically be part of a sustainable future for Andamooka township and community.

Anyone who is interested in joining in with planting, propagation or care of the gardens is encouraged to contact the town office as we are keen to form a 'community gardeners group' to take this project into the future.

The Quiz Night is a relaxed, crazy night of fun and games for all ages, so if you missed out this year, start thinking about getting a team together for 2020. Teams will be busy practicing and watching TV quiz shows to make sure they are ready to join in the contest for the winner's trophy in August 2020.

Wolfgang (Wolf) Schwob


Died peacefully at home, 23 September 2019.

Aggressive Behaviour in Dogs and the Dog Owners Responsibility

Dog owners are reminded that if their dog attacks another person or animal the owner is likely to be expiated. A dog's aggressive behaviour including harassing or chasing can also be expiated

All dog owners have a responsibility to ensure their dog is registered, desexed and microchipped, shows good behaviour and is well looked after; desexing your dog has proven to reduce aggressive behaviour in dogs.

The Dog and Cat Management Act 1995, Section 44(2) clearly states that:

"A person who owns or is responsible for the control of a dog is guilty of an offence if the dog attacks, harasses or chases or otherwise endangers the health of a person or an animal or bird owned by or in the charge of another person (whether or not actual injury is caused)."

Penalties apply: (a) if the dog is a
