JULY TO OCTOBER - FOCUS ON IMPROVING OUR HEALTH SERVICES

BE PART OF A RANGE OF WORKSHOPS AND FORUMS FOR YOUR OWN SAKE.... AND FOR YOUR COMMUNITY IT'S YOUR CHANCE TO HAVE YOUR SAY ABOUT IMPROVING HEALTH SERVICES FOR ANDAMOOKAN'S

Access to, and provision of local health services has been an ongoing issue for many locals and the problem is consistently raised & discussed at community forums prompting various suggestions and questions around how these can be improved. A new approach is being put in place by Government which is currently going through a consultation process towards improving regional health services, networks and greater local access.

Our community has this short window of opportunity to raise their issues & suggestions via the **'Have Your Say'** consultation on Health Service Planning for our region and to get our town's needs recognised within in this change.

We cannot stress enough the need for all Andamookans to respond to this opportunity.

Importantly, there is the opportunity for locals to drop in and to chat direct with health service consultants about our personal and community needs and experiences at the Community Hall Tuesday 7th July between 9.30am to 1.00pm. Also to add your thoughts to a wall gallery or to fill in a survey form.

If you can't make that forum, there are also forums being held in Roxby Downs and Woomera that you may be able to attend. An extended forum is being held at Roxby Downs community hub.

Additionally, the RFDS clinic will be setting up a series of workshops on various health issues focused on keeping the community healthy. The first of these is about keeping our brains healthy with information about dementia. This will be held on Tuesday 31st May at the Community Hall, between 10am and 4pm.

On another level, later this year we will host a visit from the regional Health Advisory Council (HAC), based in Port Augusta, to discuss community care. This organisation has been established to work with consumers, carers and volunteers and they are very interested in chatting with locals about health services for our community.

The lack of home care services is a primary issue for Andamooka. This will be your opportunity to meet with HAC representatives to discuss your needs and concerns, or the needs of friends or family and what might be done to improve these services.

Great news is that we are a step closer to creating a Community Produce Garden which will supply fresh seasonal fruit and vegetables to our community in the interests of their good health. These will be sold through the new community shop with proceeds reinvested into keeping the garden going.

An invitation is out to interested locals to attend a forum at the Community Hall on 28th May to share their valuable input towards upgrading and developing our community gardens and to also find out how they can get involved.

We're currently seeking volunteers to help make this venture a success, and in return it will provide a beneficial healthy activity for participants. Whether you have an hour or a day... all regular contributions of time and energy will make a difference.
