

# ANDAMOOKA COMMUNITY GARDENS SUSTAINABLE LIVING PROJECTS




## A CALL OUT TO ALL LOCAL GARDENERS... & WOULD BE GARDENERS...

Join forces with local gardeners and others who want to learn how to grow food & plants in our arid environment, and be part of the exciting Community Gardens Projects aimed to re-vitalise our town parks & native planting strips, and thanks to community funding from BHP, to get our Community Produce Garden underway. Both are key activities towards establishing healthy environs & food security to support wellbeing for future generations, and most importantly, ensuring that Andamookans' have local access to fresh and nutritious fruit and vegetables.

We're starting this Spring with the revitalization of the Town Memorial Park, which is our community gathering spot for such occasions as ANZAC and Remembrance Days. Thanks to Landscape SA grant funding the Park is being re-designed and planted out with indigenous species to support native birds, butterflies, bees, other indigenous insects and creatures, vital to maintaining a healthy ecological balance, creating a pleasant shady green space with local art installations where community members and visitors can enjoy a picnic or peaceful reflective time. In addition a scientific study of the numbers and behaviours of our local region's amazingly diverse insect population will be conducted over a period of around 5 years, which will engage local school students and citizen scientists, working together with environmentalist Kristen Messenger to observe, photograph and record species as their numbers flux across differing weather conditions and events, to study patterns.

**The Community Produce Gardening Program** will be based in an 'open to all' community garden located adjacent to the pump track watershed, with construction of protective fencing commencing in October and infrastructure across summer ready for planting in autumn 2026. The gardens will include propagation, aquaponics/hydroponics, and mushrooms plus vertical and wicking grow beds. Local home gardeners are also encouraged to be part of the Program, with access to project generated vege seedlings and to trade their surplus home-grown produce for others grown in the community garden for distribution to the community. *Join in and get growing for our future....*

## BOGONG MOTH WATCH - Join the count

Bogong Moth



For the months of OCTOBER & NOVEMBER

If you spot a rare Bogong Moth fluttering around your outdoor lights, take a photo on your phone and send it through to us on 0477 184 485 noting the date and Andamooka street name on which you took the photo.

This valuable information compiled by our local citizens will assist scientists with tracking and preserving this highly threatened species. With Andamooka now listed as a vital stop-over point for the moths as they make their annual epic journey between the central outback and

Dandenong Ranges in Victoria, we can all help to keep this amazing species alive and serving their role in maintaining a healthy Australian eco-cycle.

**Or you can send your photos as you take them to us** on 0477 184 487 together with the date and location of the sighting for each, or drop at the Town Office with your (HD) photo card or USB to download your photos. We will send the info to the Aussie Bird Count, also local experts can ID & add information to our records. Try for front, back & side shots, but just one clear shot is usually enough for an expert to identify the species. If nesting, if possible take a photo of the nest and of both parent birds. *Please don't interfere with their nest.* You might also like to record their bird-song, to add to our records. *Your valuable input will assist with on-going recognition & preservation of the great diversity of local birds for our future generations to enjoy.*

## KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS

### COMMUNITY PROJECTS & MAINTENANCE UPDATE:

- ◇ **Breaking News!!!** Thanks to OCA small grant funding, Andamooka street lights will undergo an upgrade with new high tech energy efficient solar street lights reducing light pollution & improving safe passage for foot and vehicle traffic.
- ◇ **Caravan & Camp Ground** - work continues on the upgrade and the old ablution block is undergoing a facelift. The new shade & campers shelters have been busy with great feedback from visitors.



- ◇ **The Cottages** - new stainless benches have been installed in the catering space and thanks to grant funding from FRRR new BBQ's will be installed with overhead lighting. Funding is now being sought to install additional permanent seating.
- ◇ **Splash Pad** - work is underway to have this ready for kids by the long weekend with new features to be increased after major maintenance work is undertaken next winter.
- ◇ Work continues on the signage project and funding is being sought for hard shade cover at the cottages and at the rear of the Hall including an undercover, enclosed outdoor cooking space behind the Community kitchen for BBQ and pizza ovens.
