APOMA Member & Community Meeting, July 2024

The 2024-25 CARM Agreement with the OCA for funding and managing the town was passed as accepted, and to be managed by APOMA on behalf of the Community. Due to the introduction of all user contributions towards use of facilities, programs and activities, APOMA was able to maintain the CCS at current levels for this year. The Town Management and APOMA Association Budget were presented and adopted as dynamic documents for 24/25. Quarterly budget updates will be published.

A draft outline of the 2024-27 Town & Community Plan was presented for discussion with productive feed back received from the floor, and work will continue with this vital document towards adoption at the 2024 AGM. We believe that we have seen the post Covid bubble finally burst which has bought new enthusiasm for life back into the town and there is great demand for activities. BUT.. activities need people power to drive them successfully and keep them going, and for Andamooka that means people putting up their hands to volunteer. There are several community projects underway that would greatly benefit from someone finding a spare couple of hours to volunteer.

Bingo could be held more frequently if there was more volunteers and funds raised will go back into community programs and activities.

Events can be great fun for volunteers and activities such as Trivia events and a Quiz Night are just as much fun for presenters as for participants, and great fundraisers.

The new community produce garden project is going into the initial planning stages, and this offers loads of opportunities to get involved. So come on..
