Easter long weekend in Andamooka is The first fundraiser for the weekend is traditionally a 'welcome back' to residents returning from their summer Cottages which kicks off around 5.30 retreats, and a Welcome Opening to the visitor season, and in 2025, Easter will be alive with a host of events and activities.

The weekend's fundraising activities will be concentrated on Andamooka's local Volunteer Emergency Services, which are currently under threat due to retirement of long-term volunteers and a desperate need for new younger volunteers to train as ambulance drivers, fire fighting and emergency and rescue.

In emergencies Andamookans are very lucky to have an ambulance 5 minutes from our door, fire crews nearby when needed, and emergency crews in town to help out when hit by extreme weather events or if unfortunately stranded on a back track.

But this local presence is currently under threat, without right numbers the services will be locally lost and if lost, it will be very difficult to get the services back into the Town.

Overview of APOMA Member & Community Meeting

APOMA Member and Community meeting was held on Sunday 30 March to provide progress updates for 2024-25 and to commence the annual procedure around the Andamooka Community Asset & Resource Management Agreement with the Outback Communities Authority (OCA) for 2025-26.

An overview of progress with maintenance and projects explained delays caused by the continual extreme heat events extending from November 2024 to the end of March 2025 setting back schedules for a number of projects and maintenance jobs. With cooler temperatures finally back, schedules will be progressively caught up with, across autumn and should be back on track before next summer.

Work continues on the Hall/Hub upgrade and the gardens have survived a long hot summer thanks to the efforts of volunteer gardens coordinator, Deb Mundy, our 2025 Citizen of the Year. Work on the Hub Children's play spaces will pick up in April. The splash pad requires major maintenance undertaken over winter to support the new features to be installed, funded by an OCA small community grant.

The Caravan & Camp-Ground new 4-way camping shelter is under construction and the two new shade shelters have been well utilised over summer. The upgraded ablutions are being landscaped. Funding is currently being sought to install outdoor fitness equipment across the rear of the pump track under-cover leisure space. *Recognition was given to the excellence of work done by APOMA staff member Michelle Cox, to maintain ablution block, public conveniences and BBQs cleanliness, and to keep public spaces and gardens so well serviced and maintained.*

\$15k BHP Community Donation was secured for the Community Produce Garden Project Stage 1- for installation of perimeter fencing which will be surrounded by a protective perimeter of trees. Old Grader Shed new extensions will add woodworking space to the community workshop, dedicated Veterans social space and a community arts and crafts wet-room to encourage skills-building and to provide for a raft of community leisure activities.

Work will continue at the Andamooka Cemetery over the cooler months to repair damage to some of the older gravesites. *Volunteers are welcome*. Thanks to the dedicated efforts of Wayne Dries, the Historic Cemetery restoration has exceeded expectations. Wayne has succeeded in identifying various graves and establishing their parameters. *Those in attendance send a thank you to Wayne*.

Upgrades set to commence on the Old Vets building on Christmas Hill Road into a Mosaics, Glass and Clay work-room managed by members of the Lapidary Club and Andamooka Arts Collective.

Andamooka Community Health and Wellbeing Advocacy Group (ACHWAG) Coordinator, Kat Wilby, explained that APOMA via the Town Office has progressed procurement of the Old Mines Office with relevant Government agencies, with the hope that the premises can be secured in time for a major funding submission to be lodged end of September, for an upgrade to best service the needs of the town and local and visiting service providers.

Progressing the 2025-26 CARM Agreement & Budget

An overview of the Andamooka Community Asset and Resources Management (CARM) Agreement, undertaken with the Outback Communities Authority (OCA) annually, and the associated community contributions scheme (CCS), its purpose, processes and procedures, was given prior to the presentation of the first draft of the proposed 2025-26 CARM budget.

The CARM Budget is a guide to expenditure of assigned funds, subject to minor adjustment as the year progresses. Historically in general, each section of the budget falls around budget annually. A first draft budget with APOMA recommendations was put forward for explanation and discussion, and to secure support for the Committee to take the resulting draft forward to negotiate with the OCA on behalf of the community. A resolution to proceed towards the 2025-26 CARM Agreement was supported unanimously on the hands.

KEEPING UP WITH BUSINESS:

FINDING A BALANCE - Andamooka Town & Community Plan.

The primary community task identified within the Andamooka Town and Community Plan is to find a balance between the old and the new, following in the footsteps of our town's pioneers who learned to work together despite differences, to build and establish our quirky outback home.

- Respecting the culture and expectations of established residents and property owners and those of new residents and property owners as we develop and service the town. Volunteers have been the life-blood of Andamooka, and there is an urgent need for young volunteers to join and support vital services in order to retain/maintain these locally in the town.

- Business development melding established and ingrained business with new opportunities and ideas... this extends to development of currently unused or under-utilised properties in the process of being scoped for business premises.

- Upskilling and developing employment opportunities, increasing wealth and wellbeing... new facilities and programs such as development of the media room and grader shed workshop will assist with this.

- Facility development to cater across a broader culture...which depends on constructive feedback from the community to assist with planning, funding and prioritisation.

- Program and service delivery and development to serve a broader community.. The proposed development of the old mines office will assist this, as will on-going development of new leisure programs, equipment and activities.

- Development of visitor attractions and facilities in line with current trends and expectations / needs... recognition was given that new residents may be more in touch with current trends and so their contributions will assist with meeting outside and new expectations and needs, but with recognition for the history and culture of the town which attracts visitation, and for the legacy left by the towns pioneers who built this town together through tolerance, respect and all putting in, many over and above, with no sense of entitlement.

- Reaching and connecting with all members of the community utilising traditional channels and new technologies... which includes development of the new website and social media networks, and programs like ACHWAG offering care for many vulnerable members of our community.

Overall the Committee has recognised this first requires consolidation – so the approach to 2025-26 is for utilising what we have to service needs and seeking funding opportunities to best develop assets which includes Andamooka's culture and environment, whilst taking advantage of opportunities as they arise.

Those in attendance at the meeting agreed with this approach for the community as a whole.. old and new, to encourage inclusion and constructive interaction, and volunteering, to ensure that vital services remain close by in our town to meet our needs in emergencies. Also exploring ways to make differences productive and bringing community together to enrich the culture of the town.


